If you are looking for a fun time on the water, check out Salty Sam's Boat Rentals. You can rent boats for a half-day,



full-day or week long rentals. The boats are equipped with everything you need. They have a variety of boats and sizes.

Every year we get a group of people together and rent a boat and spend the entire day cruising and at the beach. Everyone brings beach chairs, towels, drinks, food and music and we just enjoy a beautiful day together. We walk along the beach and look for shells, cool off in the beautiful water and we have seen dolphins every time we have gone out.

If you reserve a boat, you just need to arrive about an hour early to watch the safety video. It's best if someone has some experience driving a boat in water like that.

The rentals can be anywhere from 4.5 to 7 hours (some have restrooms):

7 passenger Center Console starting at 4.5 hours for \$229

8-20 passenger Power Catamarans starting at 4.5 hours for \$209

8 passenger Bowriders starting at 4.5 hours for \$350 10-14 passenger Trimaran starting at 4.5 hours for \$239



FROM THE DESK OF THE NIGHT PATROL COORDINATOR

Again, the residents of Forest Park would like to thank those that have stepped up for the summer patrols. Especially those that have volunteered to take more than one evening per month. We are still 12 spaces shy of a full month of evening patrols.

I have picked up 3 nights, Ken Parsels 2 nights, Brian Hafer 2 nights, new addition Wayne Hall 2 nights. When you see these people out and about, please be sure to thank them.

The Night Patrol consists of driving the entire Community in the evening anywhere from 11 pm on at your leisure or choice. The doors should all be checked to ensure locked around each building. The only door unlocked would be the Sauna. The doors on the Vehicles

parked by the Maintenance shed should also be checked unless the truck is checked out by someone to do the patrol. Each street should be checked with the yellow flashing light atop your vehicle or golf cart. Any light post lights out should be noted in the notebook in the bag and the office notified in the workday morning so it can be called in. The poles have a series of yellow numbers on a tag that should be documented along with the street and nearest home address. A slow full run of the Community takes about an hour and a half to 2 hours. Several of us will sit at the entrance with the light flashing for approx. 5-10 minutes as a deterrent. I can gladly take anyone that's willing to take a night around during the day or ride with me on my scheduled night to see what this entails.





COMMITTEE UPDATES:

The Camera Committee

We have heard from Epic Communication regarding the contract to upgrade our Surveillance system cameras. The paperwork has been signed by them and will be hand delivered the afternoon of Monday May 9th. Once the contracts are reviewed and signed by Ken the Park president we'll be put on a schedule approx. 3 weeks from then. The install of new cameras with system upgrades should take 4-7 days. There WILL NOT be any interruption in internet or WiFi during this process. Thank you all for your patience, we'll keep you posted as we move forward and the system is up and running.

Streets and Drains

As the liaison for the BOD and the S & D committee I'd like to let you all know that Dave Paquette and Mike Noel have been diligent in getting contractor surveyors to the Community for Bids to survey the drains and ditches. Once we have them, a company will be chosen and the County will be notified along with LIS engineering so we can be informed of our next move. As we progress through this phase, with County help, we'll have a better understanding of what we need to get bids on and how long the process will take. Thank you Mike and Dave for your diligence.

Maintenance Shed Roof - Update only

The roof went under contract today, it is getting permitted and replaced before months end.

Document Review Committee

We wish to thank the Committee for continuing to work together to provide updates for our Deed of Restrictions and By-Laws. The updates were presented to the Board a few weeks ago and specific areas were reviewed by our lawyer for legal requirements.

The documents have been updated to reflect the format which was recommended as a best practice (words to be deleted will be shown with a strikethrough and words to be added will be underlined). Updates from our lawyer regarding wording or legal concerns have also been amended.

The final version will be presented to the Board at the end of May. The intent will then be to send it out to our members for review over the summer. The two documents will be sent out via email, FPPOA members only page and regular mail (depending on the communication method that has been set-up for you personally).

To ensure that our members are provided an opportunity not only to review the documents, but have a method to provide feedback and/or ask questions, the Document Review Committee telephone numbers will be included, so they may be contacted. All calls or correspondence from our members will be documented, including the question and the answer provided.

2023 Budget

Information was shared at the April Membership Meeting that the Board wanted to spend a little more time reviewing the budget in more detail. The committees have been provided an opportunity to have some additional input into the planning for 2023.

The intent is for the Board to review the updated budget at the end of May and then it will be issued to our members so they have an opportunity to review it over the summer. You will be provided an opportunity to respond with any questions or concerns. In October there will be a Question & Answer Meeting to share the overall direction and reasons for the budget allocations and to answer any additional questions anyone may have. We welcome any input from our members – this is an important piece of the day-to-day running and future development of Forest Park.

Transparency and communication will be key as we share our plans and costs for 2023 and the next few years.



FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS



Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park

recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.).

The wristbands are normally available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along.

Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules & Regulations.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to approve the initiative to have all residents place paint, pesticides, chemicals, florescent bulbs and gas bottles at curbside.

Park employees will pick up these materials on Tuesday and Friday and log them in. These articles will be stored and disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members.

The rules and regulations have been changed to reflect the process.




