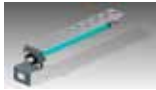

### Change

I was thinking the other day about change. Even in the last few years of my life there has been so much change. I retired from a job I loved and left many friends. We sold our home of 30 years and moved into our weekend home, which has beautiful memories, but a little further away from friends. I now have an opportunity to spend my winters in Forest Park and have met some wonderful people, including gratefully moving onto the Board with all its exciting opportunities. We are all looking at what is important to us, but when we reflect back....just think about all the changes you have gone through so far in your lifetime...all those experiences are unique to you.

Even in our Park there continues to be ongoing change and development. There are many past and ongoing projects that are shared with our residents. Some you will be passionate about and others you may not have any strong opinion. We have long term residents and quite a few new ones who have joined us. Ultimately, we are still dealing with CHANGE and it is important to acknowledge while some people adapt easily, others may just need some extra time spent on something, or more explanation on a particular topic.

Please remember that questions are a good thing. They can help you understand something that is just sitting there ‘niggling’ in your mind and they can help with choice and decision making. As we move into the fall and our residents who are away return, things will get back into full swing. There will be some excitement starting from the many clubs in the park, but also some General Meetings where it’s a first opportunity to bring forward proposals and at a later stage calls to vote on some key park business topics.

As a fun piece, I thought about a video I watched some time ago, all about change, It showed some of the changes experienced by one person in their 100 years of life. I can’t share the full affect that I saw on the screen but here are some things to think about....

**1903** Was when the first sustained powered airplane took to the sky with one person, travelling 120 feet in 12 seconds.....1998 commercial airliners carried 614 million passengers over thousands of miles.

**1900s** Horse & Buggies were a common mode of

transportation.



It apparently took only fifty cars to be manufactured to fully unseat horses as the preferred mode of transportation. One of the reasons why is that horses were also useful in rural areas, where they doubled as both transportation and work hands — cars aren’t exactly helpful in that way. Now, riding in a horse and buggy is mainly just a tourist activity.

**1900s** Letters were largely mailed and transported by trains, trucks or motorcycles. The first airmail was in May 1918. Today, communication can be transmitted instantaneously by email or phone, but back in 1918 that luxury didn’t exist.



While the US Postal Service is still around today, less and less people are mailing things. One hundred years ago though, people were marveling at the idea of simply being able to fly mail across the country.

Think of that sink and toilet we use every day.

Indoor plumbing became more readily available in **1930**, but it wasn’t until the **1960s** that the outhouse started to disappear. (Thank goodness, I still remember ours).



**1920s** Telephones were counted in the census and found them in 55% of households. This reached 94% in 1997 and now some landlines are disappearing with the introduction of cell phones.



Not quite the same look though.

**1930’s** radios were in about 4 in 10 households. By the **1970s** almost all households had at one.

**1940s** Brought the introduction of the first electronic digital computers.

They are now commonplace in households and communications have evolved to include meetings through zoom for work and doctors etc. Even think about our General Membership Meetings and how some can still participate even if they are not back in Forest Park yet.



During the Second World War, the **1940s** bring some of the greatest inventions of all time. And in the peaceful years that followed, all that inventing in ways never imagined. Featured inventions include: **the jet engine, the computer, the microwave oven, kitty litter, and the Crash Test Dummy.**

**1950s** was the introduction of widespread television. Starting black and white and moving to color.

Think about how much change one person has experienced. The first car, flight, radio, TV, space flight, computer to name a few. There was a fast change into

technology in later years and we are all doing our best to keep up with that.

**Be proud of how much you have navigated through your changes.**

## FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS

Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.).

The wristbands are normally available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along.

Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules & Regulations.



## HAZARDOUS WASTE

Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to approve the initiative to have all residents place paint, pesticides, chemicals, florescent bulbs and gas bottles at curbside.

Park employees will pick up these materials on Tuesday and log them in. These articles will be stored and disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members.

The rules and regulations have been changed to reflect the process.

## GREEN TREE STICKER

There is a little green tree sticker available in the office that goes on the **LEFT SIDE OF YOUR BACK WINDOW** of your car. All residents with automobiles should have this highly visible authorization to be in the Park. This will help the safety patrol on their nightly rounds. If you are temporary resident and don't want any stickers on your window, then scotch tape it there while you are here.



## RECYCLE BLUE BIN

The blue bin is used for all *other types* of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, etc. This is a separate Program from our regular trash that is picked up on Tuesday,

The recycle truck comes on Fridays.

Please do Not Use the can as an ashtray. Beer Drinkers, please rinse out the can and turn it over to dry out. Please remember to put your aluminum cans in a bag and place UNDER YOUR MAILBOX by 5:00 P.M. MONDAY EVENING for pick up. Please make sure your cans are rinsed CLEAN and DRY. Please place away from trash bags. DO NOT place plastic, glass or metal cans in the bag. Those go in the blue recycle bins. # Let's Talk About Self-Care

## ***Self-Care Definition***

Any activity that we do deliberately in order to take care of our mental, emotional, and physical growth.

Activities that replenish us and nourish us to stay balanced in body mind and spirit, keeping us fit and resilient in times of physical or emotional stress.

## ***Basic Self Care:***

- Get enough sleep – Not enough sleep can drain you emotionally and physically
- Hydrate – In the morning before you caffeinate and throughout the day
- Healthy eating - What kind of fuel supports your energy and growth?
- Physical activity – Work this into your daily or weekly plan
- Connection with others – People are the most important thing in our lives
- Saying no! And being assertive – be true to yourself and your needs
- Relaxing – Take time to do what you enjoy or what refuels you
- Reducing stress – Be aware of what causes stress and seek out resources or people who can help
- Spend a few minutes regularly to take care of your own needs (like putting your own oxygen mask on first, before helping someone else.) How much time do you have to support your well-being?

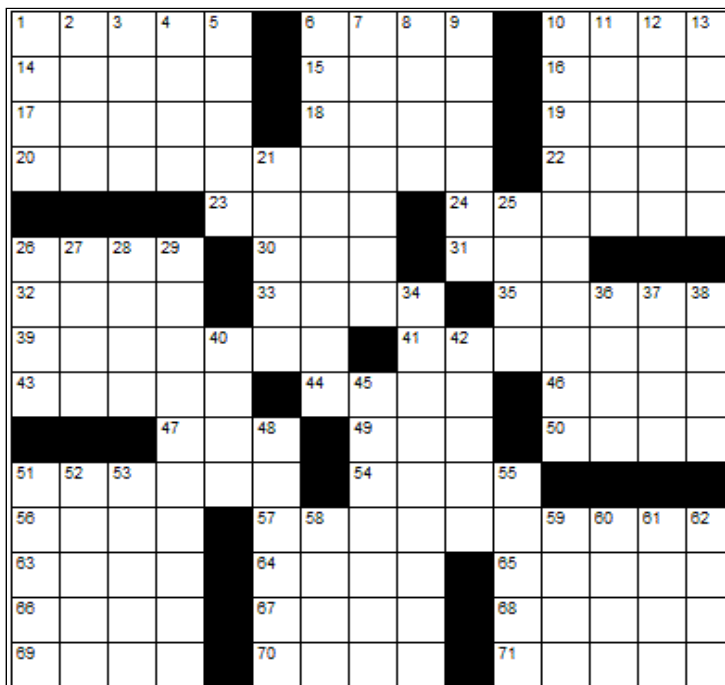

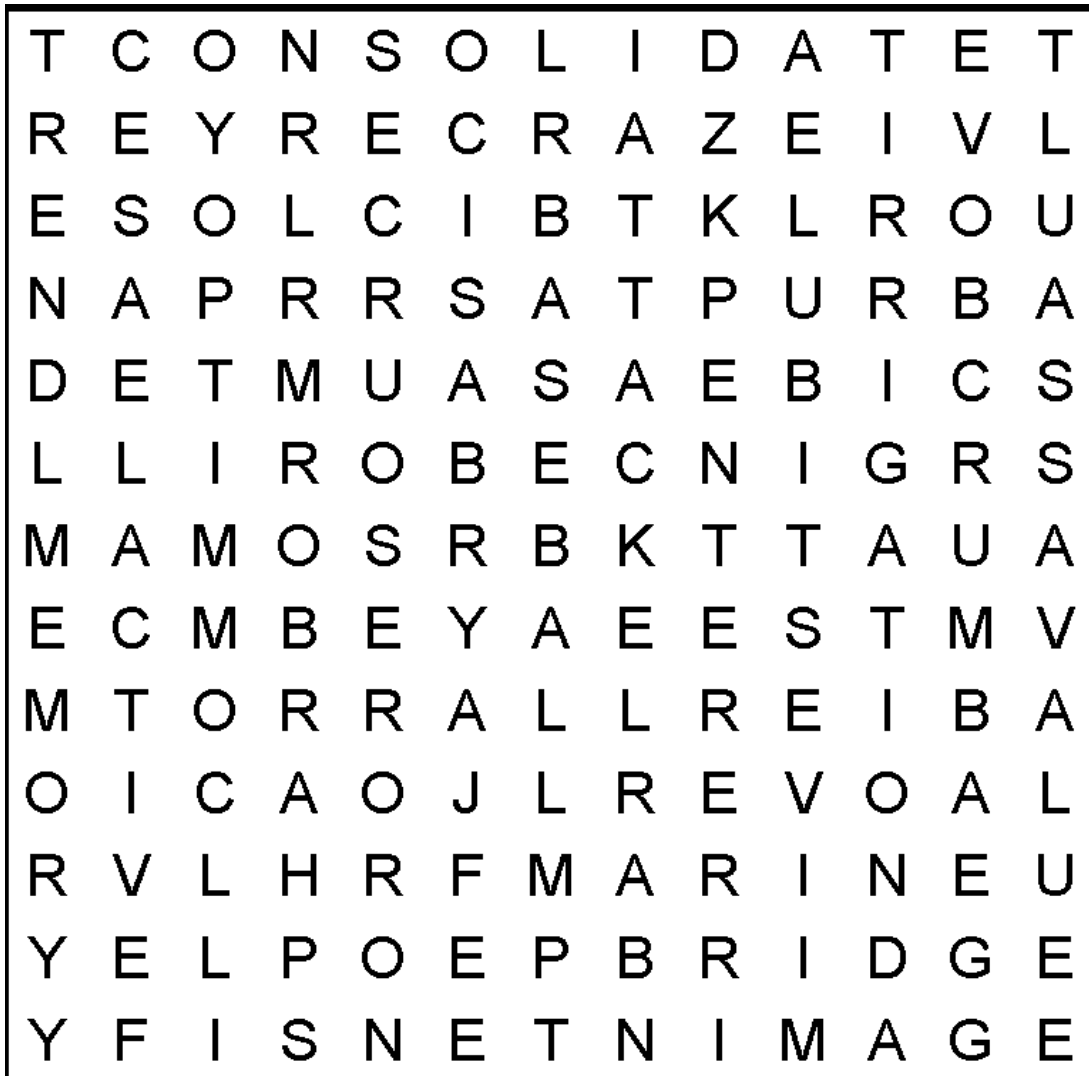
