LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK.....

Whew was January 2019 a busy time or what? No one can truly say there was nothing to do. I hope everyone enjoyed all the activities. Thanks to all who work so hard to make all of these possible.

LETS TALK BUSINESS, yes FOREST Park is a Business, a Corporation in fact and had many business functions. This requires a regime of Directors and Officers who are elected to provide as a leadership team to build community and effectively manage the relationship between property owners and governing documents.

As elected and assigned Board members responsibility requires them to exercise

DUTY OF CARE. Two of the most common ways to breach duty of care is for the lack of enforcement of governing documents and the lack of "sound business judgement" in making financial decisions. Often communities have a reputation of being overly aggressive in enforcing community rules. But with good reason, for this kind of diligence, the board members are required by law as fiduciaries of the community to enforce all covenants, rules, guidelines, and by-laws. If the board members are not enforcing the rules the association would be liable for breaching its duty of care.






