To the Forest Park Community,

Residents of North Fort Myers have recently been victims of scams such as: the grandparent scam – where a scam artist calls and pretends they are the victim's grandson or granddaughter and asks for the victim to wire money to 'fix a car' or 'bail them out of jail,' the contractor scams – where scam artists go door to door offering services that often require money up front and never perform the service, and we still have local residents falling victim to lottery scams.

Please take a minute to read the following tips and reminders to protect yourself from these and other scams.

- When receiving a phone call from a supposed family member, do your research and call that family member back at the phone number you have for him/her. If it's a grandchild, call their parent to see how the child is.
- It is a **RED** flag if a contractor solicits door to door and/or requires substantial payment up front!
- If it sounds too good to be true, it probably isn't true! You can not win the lottery unless you physically purchased that specific lottery ticket!

Scams are on the rise, especially during this time of year and the nation's economy. Be vigilant, ask questions, and stay alert. If you need further assistance the Lee County Sheriff's Office has a fraud line that you can contact at 477-1242.

The random presence of the patrol roaming our streets at night has proven to provide us with one of the safest communities in the area. Forest Park wifi system has been operating without any major problems since last spring. There have been over 160 users sign on to the system this fall. Some of the users were visitors to the park over the Thanksgiving holidays. We currently have, on average, around 90 users signed on each day. COMPLAINTS & PETITIONS

We have been receiving complaints and petitions with numerous names signed on them and without addresses. It takes an unreasonable amount of time for me and the office staff to try and decipher the names and then look up the addresses for a response. Therefore we have amended the complaint form to have a place for the complainants name, address and signature. If you wish to include other complainants, we ask that you use a Petition Form which we have developed for that purpose and can be picked up at the office. It has a space to clearly state the condition or request, and spaces for each name, address, and signature. This must be stapled or otherwise attached to the Complaint Form.

The Petition form has a space for the CIRCULATORS name and address. This is the person we will respond to. It will be that person's responsibility to distribute or otherwise inform all those who signed the petition.

Please be advised that petitions carry no legal weight except for recalls of Board Members as stated in the By-Laws. The method we would encourage is for you to request of the President that you be put on the agenda of an upcoming Board Meeting to address your area of interest or concern. If you are then not satisfied with the Boards response, you may have a right to address the General Membership.

Thank you for your cooperation on this.
