**FPPOA BOARD OF DIRECTOR
THANK YOU MESSAGE**

A few years ago I volunteered to serve on the FPPOA board of directors, now it's drawing to a close. Someone else can have a chance to serve the park.

I asked questions when I first moved into the park and curiosity almost "killed the cat". I've read the governing documents more than once since I started. Did you know that either last year or this year, the legislature says that a board member must certify they have read and understand these documents to serve. Convolutod is a term that attorney Joe Adams has used to describe the procession of development our documents have taken.

For the most part it has been an interesting ride. The boards I've served on have done some good things for the park and there have been a few times I could have done without. Some of the improvements can be seen in the common grounds but other things like system changes and upgrades in the business operation of the park are not as visible. Forest Park is a nice place to call home, but it is also a small business and needs to continue to be run like one, with proper safeguards in place.

Looking forward, the Park will continue to be impacted yearly by the state legislature who write rules for the 17,000 to 20,000 associations like ours in Florida. We are also affected by an average normal turnover of 10 % a year of our population. In the last few years we have been affected by a severe down turn in the real estate market which has resulted in a few foreclosures in our park, even though to a much lesser extent than the general economy of the area. Governmental regulations also affect us whether it's trees we plant or buildings we wish to add or modify.

We need interested, informed people from all walks of life to share their talents with Forest Park.....please think about running for one of the open positions on the Board.

ALUMINUM RECYCLE
