F.P.P.O.A. BOARD NEWS

TRASH PICK UP

This service is provided by FPPOA for all residents. Please read Section XIII of the Rules and Regulations of Forest Park (below). Bags should not exceed 30 pounds in weight. Please make sure your trash bag will be picked up by keeping the weight under the 30 lb. limit. The Trash and Horticulture committee has instructed Butch & Steve to leave any bag over the 30lb. limit. If it is separated into bags meeting the limit, the trash will be picked up the next trash day.

BLUE BARREL RE-CYCLE

The blue barrel is used for all *other types* of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash and the truck comes on Wednesdays.

XIII. GARBAGE, TRASH AND HORTICULTURE

FPPOA will provide garbage, trash and horticulture removal/pick-up service.

The following conditions must be met by all residents/occupants:

- A. Pickup is on Tuesdays and Fridays (or as determined by the FPPOA Board of Directors with sufficient notice). (Please keep horticulture separate)
 Bundles torn open by animals will not be picked up.
- B. Items are to be placed in front of home on your own property no earlier than 6pm the day before pickup and no later than 7am on pickup day. Do not put on the road as it could create a hazard.
- C. Bags must be plastic of good quality. If they break, you must clean it up.
- D. The filled bag weight must not exceed 30 pounds.
- E. Bags must be tied.
- F. Horticulture limbs must be tied securely and not exceed four (4) feet in length and sixteen (16) inches in diameter. Tree limbs are not to exceed four (4) inches in diameter.
- G. Do not mix garbage and horticulture in the same bag.
- H. Residents are not permitted in the maintenance area to dump trash in dumpsters at any time.
- I. Boxes (corrugated cardboard) must be broken down, tied and left out with the blue recycle bin on Wednesdays (or as determined by the Board of Directors).

J. Contractors, lawn cutters, etc. working at your home are responsible for removing trash and horticulture from the park.

K. To have appliances and large items removed, call the office for the number to be called for free pick-up.

F.P.P.O.A. BOARD NEWS

The Board of Directors has approved the following Committees:

Construction Committee: The Construction Committee, led by Ron Moon will review all new contracts, to make sure we are getting what we are paying for, and that the contracts are properly written. Unless it is impractical to do so in certain cases, we will insist on at least two bids or quotes on work or replacement equipment. The committee will also be composed of members and advisors with experience in the various trades. We will call on their expertise to make sure that we really need the recommended repairs or replacement of equipment and are not being "oversold". The Committee will advise the BOD on letting of contracts, make sure permits are pulled when required, that insurance and license of contractors is in force, follow the progress, and make sure the job is properly done before final payment is made.

Legal Committee: The most common complaints I have heard relate to pets and lack of rule enforcement. The Legal Committee will be reactivated and the first thing we will do is to identify all of the pets residing in non pet areas and take whatever action is available and necessary. I love my pet but we made sure she was allowed before we bought on Palm Frond Court. If you know of a pet which lives and is let outside in Non Pet sections, send a complaint to the office.

By-Law Committee : The newly appointed By-Law Committee under the leadership of Dale Monette has started reviewing our current By-Laws, the notes from the Committee of 2-3 years ago, and the proposed By-Laws submitted to the membership last month, in addition to amendments submitted to the committee. Dale expects to have a rewrite completed for presentation at the February Membership meeting with a vote at the March meeting. Dale and the other members, Kay Westall, Sherrill Wright, LoRita Hettich and Dave Brugh are all well versed in the current language and interpretation of the By-Laws and have spent much time on previous committees. I have confidence that they will produce a document which makes necessary modifications, cleans up language, duplication and conflict and can be easily read, in a booklet also containing our Deed of Restrictions and Rules. Upon completion of the By-Laws, I will ask them to continue with the Rules and Regulations. In future columns I will address the written legal opinions which we have, regarding what rules and regulations we have the authority to make or not make.

Financial Overview Committee: Dave Small and Anna Thatcher have the responsibility of overseeing our financial situation, not to conflict with or interfere with the Board or Treasurer, but to offer advice on how we conduct our financial affairs within the scope of generally acceptable accounting procedures. They will also assist in putting together written procedures for the office and other BOD responsibilities, so that we can have continuity from one administration to the next.

<u>Planning Committee:</u> Jim Barnett will head our Planning Committee. We would like representatives from the major Clubs to serve on this committee, either as members or advisors, so that we have a broad spectrum of interests in making longer term plans for Forest Park. What do we want? What do we need? What can we afford? Want, need and afford should guide the Committee.

Real Estate Committee: Lee Fisher and Floyd Hasler will serve on this committee and attempt to keep us abreast of the situation regarding vacant homes in foreclosure in FP. We want to do whatever we can legally do and within our ability to do so, to keep investors from buying to rent or profit from foreclosures, etc., of these homes. Additionally, it is in our best interest to work with local agents and realtors to make sure that people interested in buying in Forest Park are fully aware of our restrictions and requirements.

<u>Sergeants at Arms</u>: Al Thatcher and Melton Herrick have agreed to act in this capacity at Membership Meetings. They will handle the microphones when people are speaking from the floor and provide assistance to anyone needing it including perhaps whispering in the ear of anyone who has been ruled out of order (but I don't expect that will be needed.)

When the wifi system is slow it could mean that the internet traffic is heavy and/or the site we are trying to go to may be extra busy. We have a test that we run so that we can isolate the problems when they occur.

Outside antenna users-- if your system is extremely slow, try unplugging the antenna's little black box from the AC outlet for 30 seconds, and then retry.

Once again, please note that the speed limit is 15 MPH in Forest Park and STOP signs are posted at various intersections. These are not public streets, they are private. The incentive for compliance is not the risk of getting a ticket, but rather to use the utmost caution and regard for your fellow residents who walk our streets, ride their bikes or travel in golf carts.

<u>Forestparkonline.com</u> has a new feature. It's called a blog. Either go to <u>blogs.forestparkonline.com</u> or click the menu button on our home page.

A blog (short for web log) is basically a journal that is available on the web. The activity of updating a blog is "blogging" and someone who keeps a blog is a "blogger." Blogs are typically updated using software that allows people with little or no technical background to update and maintain the blog. Postings on a blog are arranged in chronological order with the most recent additions featured most prominently. It is common for blogs to be available as RSS feeds.

RSS (*Really Simple Syndication***)** is a family of web feed formats used to publish frequently updated works—such as blog entries, news headlines, audio, and video—in a standardized format. You can add an RSS feed to your home page(Google,Yahoo, etc.) by clicking on the *entries RSS* button on the right hand side of the blog page and following the instructions there. You will then be automatically up to date without having to check the page every day.

WHO WILL SIGN YOUR DEED WHEN YOU ARE DEAD?

Nobody who has lived in Forest Park has lived forever. In the last few years, several residents have died without a will or what is legally known as intestate. There is a plan for your assets (your home and belongings in Forest Park) after your death..... either your plan or one made for you by the State of Florida. You most likely would prefer your own plan, but that requires at least a simple will.

If you have no plan and die intestate, somebody has to file an affidavit for a summary administration of your estate with the court, there are costs involved for the court to handle this process and it can be quite lengthy in time to process before a judge or personal representative can prepare to convey your property to a new owner. While this process is working, your property is running down physically, the lot is growing weeds, and your friends and neighbors in Forest Park are having to make up your share of the park income, no longer being paid monthly by you.

In the current documents governing the park there is no authority granted to anyone to step in and resolve this problem. So properties sit and run down and make the park look bad.

You can make a plan with your attorney, it doesn't have to be elaborate or expensive, but you need a plan. If you need help with this check the "Resource Book" located at the back of the clubhouse or check with the legal committee for more information.
