F.P.P.O.A. BOARD NEWS**************By: Bob Dickerson, President FPPOA***

Well the winter season is upon us again, time flies. Some folks are back, some are still up North and some have never left. But soon we will all be together again to enjoy the great Southwest Florida weather and the good fellowship with our friends and neighbors in Forest Park.

The summer was somewhat eventful in Forest Park. We saw the finish of the Powell Creek Project (I am looking forward to walking the trails and seeing Forest Park from the other side of the fence); we developed sink holes around the putt putt course; and we had our first experience in real estate sales. We have had several telephone conference Board Meetings to discuss these and other issues.

POWELL CREEK

Apparently the project is finished and our fences have been restored. Mary has been in contact with the project manager to make sure that they are fully completing and restoring the area to at least pre-project condition and in some cases, better than it was.

MINIATURE GOLF COURSE & SINK HOLES

You may have heard that holes started appearing in and around the miniature golf course. In order to determine the extent of the problem we hired a contractor to remove the gravel and ground cover. We found several holes, some as deep as 10 feet. One option was to completely remove the dirt and debris in the entire area and refill it with the proper fill. Apparently when the sewage disposal plant was removed, this area which, as I understand, was a sediment pond, was filled with concrete, shrubs, limbs and whatever else could be found to fill it up. It seems that over the years the horticulture matter has decomposed and has left voids which the surface top soil has filled. To remove and refill would cost in the neighborhood of \$100,000 which the Board felt should not be done at least until the membership has a chance to review the matter. In the meantime we had loads of fill dirt and sand brought in and our maintenance crew along with Board of Director, Richard Taylor has filled in the existing holes. So far we have spent around \$2000 to have the putt putt course removed along with the gravel and ground cover and \$2700 to bring in new fill, for a total of roughly \$4700. It is our plan to closely watch for additional holes and fill them in as they appear. This, hopefully, will gradually eliminate the problem at considerable less expense than having the whole area excavated and refilled.

We will have to discuss at a later date whether the golf course is to be rebuilt, and if so, where? No structures can be placed in the problem area now or, in all probability, in the future. We can beautify the area and expand the memorial garden and have a walking path if we want to. We will discuss this entire situation when everyone has returned.

As you no doubt know, the property at 855 Hollyberry was left in horrible condition when the owner died. We had it cleaned out and with the assistance of our real estate attorney were able to purchase the property, pay off the mortgage, and secure title of the property for a very reasonable cost.

The Board met several times to consider what options we had. Some thought we should have it repaired and sell it ourselves, some wanted to demolish the building and sell the land, and some felt we should try to sell it "as is". In the end, we all agreed that if we could get a reasonable offer (and we had a verbal offer at that time) that we should get out from under it and let someone else repair and resell it. We subsequently got a written offer which the Board countered and the buyer accepted. As I write this, on October 22nd, we are expecting to close the deal tomorrow, Tuesday.

Our intent was to help preserve the beauty of Forest Park by removing this eye sore. The purchaser has agreed to finish the repairs within 90 days of getting possession and will start paying the maintenance fees immediately. We will be recovering all of our expenses and the past due maintenance fees and a little bit more. We might have been able to hold off and try to get more money for it, but I think it has worked out for the best.

While it is not our intent to enter into real estate transactions on a regular basis, I think it would be foolish to let properties deteriorate to the detriment of our entire community, if we are able to acquire them with similar results.

We will be looking at the number of vacant properties in the park and making inquiries to see if there are feasible alternatives to letting them deteriorate. We have a Preservation Committee to look into this. If you have experience in real estate, construction, or any area which would contribute to the Preservation of Forest Park Committee and are willing to lend your expertise, please let me know.

Wanda and I hope to be on our way South by Nov 3rd and look forward to seeing you all. Bye for now,

The blue barrel is used for all *other types* of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash which is picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays. The re-cycle truck comes on Wednesdays.
