FOREST PARK WIFI

We have added a second router to our Wi-Fi system. We now have two separate systems, but with the ability to automatically switch if one goes down. Having two systems allows each system to support 100 users and room to grow. We are trying to increase our bandwidth from 10 Mg lines to 20 Mgs lines, but for some reason unknown, Century Link is delaying this upgrade.

If you are experiencing problems with the Wi-Fi try this. If you are dropped off, or running real slow, reach down and unplug the small black box from the wall. The black box is about 3 inches by 1 1/2 inches with 2 cables on one end and an AC cord on the other. This allows the antenna to reboot and find a stronger signal. If you have a laptop directly connected to your onside antenna, make sure that your laptop wireless light is off.

We will get these Wi-Fi problems resolved! Thank you for your patience.

Judge Neighborhood Watch on its merits

N eighborhood Watch is volunteers and concerned citizens working together to reduce crime and incidents in communities coupled with the cooperative effort of the Lee County Sheriff's Office.

Neighborhood Watch does two things and two things only: observe and report. Members accomplish this by going through their everyday tasks of going to the store, picking up their mail, going out to eat, taking a walk or just sitting and looking out the back or front of the house.

I hear words all the time like "I'm retired! I did not move down here to go back to work," or "We do not have anything going on so what do we need Neighborhood Watch for?" People who say these types of statements do not understand how Neighborhood Watch works and how effective it truly is.

If you are away from your residence and you get a phone call about water streaming out of your front door, or something that hap-



pens much more frequently, "Your garage door is open," would you not like a call?

This is very similar to what it takes to have a successful Neighborhood Watch in that someone noticed a water pipe break at your house and wanted to know what to do. Or that you left your garage door open because you were late for a tee time.

How many people belong to your

Neighborhood Watch Program? Your Neighborhood Watch is the eyes and ears of your neighborhood watching out for you while you're away. The population for many

areas has increased and generates a variety of activities. Your eyes and ears are needed to OBSERVE unusual or questionable activity and CALL it in. (Observe and Report) Use your instinct and CALL when you feel something is out of the ordinary. Let the deputies check out your suspicions.

Get active

If you have a Neighborhood Watch Program and would like a meeting or would like to start a Neighborhood Watch, please call Community Relations at 477-1400.

So many times through investigations citizens have said that they saw something suspicious and did not call. CALL, CALL, CALL. Deputies are on duty 24 hours a day, seven days a week. You are not bothering anyone. We are here to service you, and again I say CALL, CALL, CALL.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO FPPOA BY-LAWS

(To be voted on at the March general membership meeting)

The current FPPOA By-Laws provide for voting on the proposed budget at the December membership meeting. Since there is seldom a quorum present at this meeting, the proposed amendment to vote on the budget at the November general membership meeting will give more members the opportunity to participate.

The other amendment is only to clarify and exemplify the authority and responsibility of the Board of Directors in the management of the affairs of the Forest Park Subdivision.

<u>BY-LAWS PROPOSED AMENDMENT –</u> ARTICLE VIII., B1

The proposed budget for the following year will be developed over multiple meetings with members in the early part of the current year. The following year's proposed budget will be presented to the Board of Directors and made available for distribution to the membership for discussion at, or prior to, the October general membership meeting (or other special meetings that may be called if necessary). The budget will be voted upon by secret ballot at the November general membership meeting. Adjustments to the proposed budget within the parameters of the CPI (Consumer Price Index) may be made as necessary prior to voting..

<u>BY-LAWS PROPOSED AMENDMENT –</u> ARTICLE VI. A

The Board of Directors means the elected Officers and Board members vested with the management of the affairs of the FPPOA and have the authority and responsibility to incorporate and enforce Rules and Regulations in accordance with the terms set therein. The Board....etc.


