At Calusa, an independent living arrangement includes housekeeping, 2 meals per day and transportation. They have a variety of activities that residents can participate in.

An interesting tip was that you could rent an apartment that includes all their amenities for a few months. Another option was that a person could purchase an assisted living apartment for your own personal respite or rehabilitation care program. Then, you would have help with all your care from personal bathing, medicine, nursing or anything specific that your doctor had ordered. There is a nurse on call 24 hours a day and they have 3 Doctor's at their facility.

A discussion about various types of payments that is allowed by Medicare concluded their program. It was a very informative program to listen to because you have to begin to think about this type of living arrangement in the future for everyone.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE *By: Bob Dickerson, President FPPOA*

Let me start by thanking everyone for the thoughts, prayers, and support we received during Wanda's recent ordeal. She is home, doing very well, and already looking forward to next season.

Well, as I have said, the membership is the ultimate authority in Forest Park. You have spoken and I fully accept your decision on the hobby building. I just hope that your decision was not based on the misleading and erroneous talk and emails, which were going around about insurance costs etc. Our insurance agent came to the last Board meeting and gave us his opinion, which refuted the rumors you no doubt had heard. If you choose not to believe me, go on our website and listen to him for yourself. In any case the hobby or "multipurpose building", which I preferred to call it, has been defeated, so I will put that behind me.

The Putt Putt and Peace Lake initiative were both narrowly passed, but then narrowly has little meaning in a democracy. The majority of those voting, voted in favor of both and so we are proceeding toward implementation.

The well and irrigation system for the Peace Lake area should be completed before next fall. This will set the groundwork for the gradual beautification of the area to begin.

The Putt Putt course requires more preliminary work prior to construction. A revision of our "Development Plan" must be submitted to the County for approval. The preliminary plan calls for the course to be constructed either in the area adjacent to the maintenance building or in the back section close to Timber Lane where a boat and RV storage existed in the past. The location by the maintenance building would require approximately five trees to be removed to eliminate the problems of sap and pine cones continually dropping on the course. This will also require approval from the County and no doubt replanting of an equal number of trees. Then bids must be secured and a contractor chosen. We hope to have this preliminary work done this summer and be ready for construction in the fall. Assuming that the County will approve both locations, the Board of Directors voted at

today's meeting (4-11-13) to take the decision on location to the Membership for a vote in the fall, probably in November. If only one site is acceptable to the County, there will be no need for a vote by the membership. Once a site is selected, construction should go very quickly and hopefully by the end of the year you will be able to start swinging (or nudging).

We will keep you updated throughout the summer in the newsletter which will be issued every month.

I hope you all have a good summer as I intend to do here, the good Lord willing.

GOVERNING DOCUMENTS BOOKLET By: Bob Lang, Secretary

By the time that you read this you should have already received a copy of Forest Park's governing documents if you attended the April General Membership Meeting. It is our plan to give them out to every red card holder who presents them self at the door for registration at that meeting. We will continue with this effort in the fall by giving a booklet to arriving (back) snowbirds when they check in with the Office. If we miss any, they can simply

request a copy from the Office.

The new booklet contains a copy of the Articles of Incorporation with amendments because it was felt that this important document should also be in the hands of all members.

These have been done in a new format so that whenever a section has changes, its few, new pages need only to be reproduced with the current revision date, and the section can be replaced by the member without the need for reproducing a completely new booklet. When you attempt to replace a section you will notice that the section has been compiled as a unit and the pages are stapled together. This has been done for a reason. And that reason is simplicity, less pages to reproduce, less margin for error if pages were to be replaced one at a time.

The only changes in these documents are these:

- 1. The By-Law changes approved at the March 28th meeting are included.
- 2. The "2 carport sales per year" approval by the Board & Membership was included. It had not been changed from the previous printing.
- 3. Several minor typos were corrected as was the number & letter designation of paragraphs to facilitate a better flow of content. (Note that in earlier copies the pool rules were inserted before the Rules & Regulations paragraphs had ended.) This has since been corrected.

If you have this booklet, you now have the most current copy. You can destroy all previous copies of a "green" book (and any other color that you may have been using).

Make sure cans are rinsed and clean and **DRY**. Please place away from trash cans/bags. DO NOT place plastic, glass or metal cans in the bag. Those go in the blue tote bins. Money collected for can recycle helps pay some of the costs of Social Club activities. So, it benefits all residents of Forest Park. This will continue all summer long.

GREEN TREE STICKER
