OBITUARY FOR REGINALD HARVEY

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Reginald "Reg" Harvey on Tuesday, July 16, 2013 at the Grand River Hospital in his 89th year. He was the loving husband of Barbara (nee Haslehurst) for 67 years. He was the loving father of Martyn (Carol) Harvey and the loving grandfather of Graeme (fiancé Kinari) and Andrew Harvey. He is survived by sisters-in-law Gwyneth Haslehurst and Freda Dowler, both of Newcastle-under-Lyme, Staffordshire, U.K. and many cousins, nieces, and nephews in Canada and the U.K. Reg will also be sadly missed by friends and neighbors in Ontario, the U.K., and Forest Park, North Ft. Myers, Florida. He is predeceased by his parents, George James and Ann (nee Martin) Harvey, and his eight siblings, Elsie, George, Jessie, Harry, Colin, Cyril, Roy, and his twin sister Marjorie, and by brothers-in-law Maurice and Jack Haslehurst.

Reg was born in Silverdale, Staffordshire, U.K. on April 21, 1925. He served his apprenticeship with the Rolls-Royce Engineering Co. during the war years working on Merlin engines for the famous Spitfire fighter planes. He served in the Royal Air Force for 2 years after the war. He then became a partner in an engineering business "Harvey and Lee Engineers." Determined to become a teacher, he returned to school to attain his teaching credentials while owning and operating a paint and hardware store. Reg began his teaching career in the mid-1950's at Broadmeadows Senior School in Chesterton, Staffordshire, U.K. and later became a senior lecturer at the North Staffordshire College of Further Education in Stoke-on-Trent, U.K. While he was teaching, Reg's entrepreneurial spirit inspired him to start another business "Hotfast Roofing Equipment" where he invented, patented, and manufactured specialized equipment for the flat roofing trade.

Reg immigrated to Canada with Barbara in 1974 where he taught drafting and machine shop at Bendale Secondary School and Sir Winston Churchill Collegiate Institute, both in Scarborough, Ontario, until his reluctant retirement in 1990. During this time, he was a member and past President of the Royal Institute of Production Engineers, Ontario Branch. After his retirement from teaching, he and Barbara moved to Waterloo, Ontario. He continued working hard in his next business venture

“R&B Enterprises” decaling and firing pottery that was sold in local British gift shops and the St. Jacob’s Farmers Market.

Reg loved spending time with his family, gardening, swimming in his pool, and going for country drives with Barbara in their white 1973 vintage Jaguar. He loved spending the winters at their Florida home in Forest Park, North Ft. Myers, where he was a past President of the Canadian Club. There he enjoyed playing euchre, bocce, shuffleboard, bingo, and line dancing. He loved being a member of the choir, being M.C. at various events, and participating in all of the park’s activities.

Reg’s determination, positive attitude, sense of humour, strong family values, and personal integrity endeared him to us. He will be sadly missed and lovingly remembered.

Family and friends are invited to the Erb & Good Family Funeral Home, 171 King St. South, Waterloo on Tuesday, July 23, 2013 for a Memorial Reception in the Erb Kumpf Suite of the funeral home from 6 to 9 pm. Cremation has taken place. Interment will be held at Parkview Cemetery at a later date.

OBITUARY FOR ARCHIE BLANDFORD

Archie Blandford was a teacher. He taught during education's golden age in London, Ontario.

Archie who died early Sunday, August 18 was also a brother, uncle, vice-principal, entrepreneur, tree farmer, minor hockey executive, coach, car enthusiast, cottager, snowbird, golfer and a son of a Lieutenant in the Royal Canadian Field Artillery and a nurse trained at Toronto General.

Archie earned a Masters in Education from Wayne State University and was a teacher and vice principal in London public school system for 34 years. He was a partner in an import export business and was an avid antique collector and dealer. Archie was instrumental in establishing the South Bruce Beach Cottage Association

and was its secretary treasurer for 39 years until 2006. He was an active director on the board of Forest Park in North Fort Myers, Florida and was an engaged participant at meetings at his residence at InSpirit.

Archie was iconic, doing things his way, yet, always with courtesy. The tragedy of all of this is found in the debilitating cancer that stole the joy from his final few months: a life of energy and experience devolved to a hospital bed. We need not remember Archie Blandford that way. Many of us have powerful memories of the man and his love of teaching not just the three Rs, but sports, antiques, cars, cottaging, tree farming, snowbirding and more.

Born in London November 8, 1928, son of Margaret Templeton Thompson and Raymond Douglas Blandford. He is survived by his sister, Margaret (Peggy) E.G. Hargraft, nieces and nephews: Peggy, Duff and Sandy Stewart and Anne Duffey and Doug Hargraft. Predeceased by his sister Mary Jane Stewart (1923-2004) and brother Raymond Frederick (1921-2007).

A service of remembrance will be held at InSpirit Residences, 81 Base Line West, London on Saturday, August 24 at 1:30 p.m. and at Ainsdale Golf Course, just outside of Kincardine on Highway 21 on Sunday, September 1 at 2 p.m. Memorial donations may be made to the Kincardine and Community Health Care Foundation, 43 Queen Street, Kincardine, ON, N2Z 1G6. Internment at Woodland Cemetery, London.

FRAUD ALERT

FROM THE OFFICE OF LEE COUNTY SHERIFF MIKE SCOTT

A Call to Duty You Will Want to Miss

September 5, 2013

The Lee County Sheriff's Office Fraud Line has received reports this week of unscrupulous individuals posing as representatives from the U.S. District Court attempting to obtain personal information and cash from residents in a scam known as the "Jury Duty" scam. Here's how the scheme works:

Your phone rings and the con-artist claims to be a court official and states you did not respond to a jury summons, which has now resulted in a warrant for your arrest. When you advise the caller you never received a summons to appear before the court, he quickly says he will "cancel the warrant" once you verify your personal information and agree to pay a small fine. At this point, the caller will give instructions on how to "wire transfer" your payment, while calmly asking for sensitive information such as your social security number, date of birth, address and bank account numbers.

If you receive such a call, do NOT give out any information and immediately hang up the phone. You can contact the Sheriff's Office Fraud Line at 239-477-1242 to report the incident. 

We lost our little dog Izzy over the summer to a strange immune disease. It was devastating to us but we are slowly adjusting to her loss. As for me, I am feeling "tolerable", as my grand daddy used to say.

As for Forest Park, except for the weather and ducks, things have been pretty good. We have obtained title to the Wenrich property on Forest Park Drive and will be offering the lot for sale. I believe we will more than cover our costs of securing the property and the eyesore will soon be eliminated.

Mary, our office manager, has been having some problems with her back and shoulders and has had to take some days off. Fortunately we have secured the services of Gerry Fleischer and Bob Castor to help out when she is off. I have been very fortunate in having Officers and Directors who have managed their areas of responsibility very well, and an office manager in Mary Diaz, who has done an outstanding job in running the day-to-day activities of the office and the Park. She has been a real blessing and I hope that we can keep her here with us for a long time.

I am hopeful that we can maintain continuity in the procedures that have been incorporated during this administration. Dave Small has worked long and hard to bring our office and accounting procedures and controls up to acceptable professional standards. It would be a shame to lose that. Dave Small and Anna Thatcher have served on the Financial Oversight Committee and have done an outstanding job along with the input of John Wright and Bob Lang. The ladies who volunteered to work in the office to help cover for Mary while she has been having shoulder problems were so very helpful. How could we have done without them? Thanks to you all.

Well, I guess that is about all for now. Unless our plans are changed, Wanda and I will be arriving in Forest Park in the last week of October. Looking forward to seeing you all then.
