F.P.P.O.A. BOARD NEWS

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE *By: Bob Dickerson, President FPPOA*

Fall is here, the weather is crisp, the leaves are turning and falling, and I have much work to do in preparing for returning to our winter haven. We will be flying this year so the biggest challenge is condensing everything we used to haul down in our motor home, into two suitcases! But I am sure the Boss will manage.

We will not be down in time for the October membership meeting but Betty will do just fine without me. One of the items on the agenda will be the announcement of the names of the Nominating (election) Committee for the next year as required by our By-Laws.

The November meeting will have the following items to consider.

1. The miniature golf course plans will hopefully be finalized for your consideration. We will talk with the County Building Department in early November. We have two potential locations for consideration, the site by the Maintenance shed, and the site west of the former course. If the Building Department tells us that either site is acceptable, we will let you decide at the November meeting. If only one is acceptable, no vote will be needed since you approved the project, in general, last spring. In any case, we hope to have the details ready to present to you.

2. There was much ado about the ducks making a mess this summer, which resulted in Legal action by one of our members and the necessity of a response by our Attorney. A recent report by one of our Board Members indicated that only a small number of the ducks were seen. Is this a problem to be addressed with extermination or is it just a nuisance, which we can live with? We will discuss it at the meeting.

3. We have had a verbal offer from Comcast (soon to be followed with contractual details) to upgrade their equipment so that they can begin marketing their service again in Forest Park. For our approval to allow them access to the park, they will give us a one-time payment of \$45,000. There would be no obligation for anyone to buy their service, but an upgraded product would eventually be available for individual consideration. I will send copies of the proposed contract to John Wright and Jim Ullrey, who have been working on this for some time, and to our Attorney to study. It will then be reviewed by the Board of Directors and reported for your review, hopefully at the November meeting.

4. Don't forget that we have elections coming up in January. Bob Lang, our Secretary will be talking about the absentee ballots procedure.

Please also remember that we the membership actually "manage" the park. While most other parks have highly paid managers, we never have and therefore are debt free with a sizable reserve to pay for any future maintenance or other contingencies. This is a considerable obligation for us seniors who for the most part are retired and want to relax. On the other hand it can be very interesting and rewarding. I encourage any of you who have an interest and or background, which could be useful in the parks management, to consider getting involved. All of the Officer positions are up for election in January and I believe two Director Positions. If you do not care to get that involved, at least attend the Membership and Board meetings. And if you are unable to attend the meetings you can watch them on our website, forestparkonline. com.

Looking forward to seeing you all very soon, Bob Dickerson, President FPPOA.


FPPOA WANTS YOU! By: Mary Diaz

ALUMINUM CAN RE-CYCLE By: Mary Beth Schleter

Please remember to put your washed out and dried out aluminum cans in a bag and place UNDER YOUR MAILBOX Monday evening for early Tuesday morning pick up. Make sure cans are rinsed and clean and DRY. Please place away from trash cans/bags. DO NOT place plastic, glass or metal cans in the bag. Those go in the blue tote bins. Money collected for can recycle helps pay some of the costs of Social Club activities. So, it benefits all residents of Forest Park.

GREEN TREE STICKER

There is a little green tree sticker available in the office that goes on the back window of your car. All residents with automobiles should have this highly visible authorization to be in the Park. This will help the safety patrol on their nightly rounds. If you are a temporary resident and don't want any stickers on your window, then scotch tape it there while you are here.

BLUE BARREL RE-CYCLE


