Swimming Exercise is held every day Monday - Friday from 9 to 10 AM.


Line Dancing is held on Friday's in the Pavilion from 9 to 10:30AM.

WI-FI IN FOREST PARK

We currently have over 200 users on our wi-fi systems. Since we have two separate systems, this number of users, isn't overloading our systems. I hear an occasional comment that the system is slow, we have to keep in mind that the internet or the site we are trying to access could be the slowness that we are experiencing. I monitor the system twice a day and our usage is exceeding what we used last spring, Based upon this every day usage, the system is providing, with a few exceptions, a valuable amenity to our park.

We have restored the RV wi-fi towers to full functionality. We have two more activities concerning the wi-fi that will result is some down time, which you will be notified of .

Just a reminder, if you can't get on the wi-fi, and you

have an outside antenna, unplug your little black box from the wall until the light goes out and then plug it back in. This reboots the antenna.

Users of laptops, Ipads, Kindles etc, who are trying to get on the wi-fi system, without a outside antenna could have problems, because of the limited ability of the unit's ability to receive and transmit a signal any distance, especially thru our metal walls. If you continue to operate with a very slow connection, it slows the system down because of the retries because of the errors. The solution is to go to the activity building and connect to the wi-fi signal called "office".




