MEN'S COFFEE/DONUT

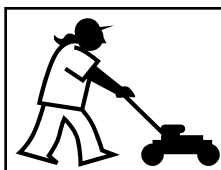

MAINTENANCE FEE LATE CHARGES **EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2014**

If you pay your maintenance fees by the month:

All maintenance fees are due on the first of each month. If you are thirty (30) days past due, you will be notified by the Board and a delinquent charge of \$5.00 will be added to your account. If the account becomes forty five (45) days past due, the Board will send a certified letter stating that you have ten (10) days to pay in full or a lien will be placed upon your property.

Example: Your monthly payment is due on April 1st. On April 30th your account is past due. On May 1st, you will be charged a late fee of \$5.00.

This action has become necessary in fairness to the majority of property owners that keep their account current. The delinquent charge is assessed in accordance with our Deed of Restrictions. Please contact our office or the Board Secretary, Diane Price, with any questions, concerns or payment plan needs.

A PROPOSED AWARDS PROGRAM

In addition there are a number of people who are not in the Park who have done great things for the Park and could include Tom McLean (deceased) and Foster Dye and I am sure there are many others. There are a number of individuals who are still in the Park that should be considered. They include John Wright Treasurer, Jan Orlando, Betty Campbell, Doug Ford for WIFI and Jim Ullrey for cameras. Again there are many more to be considered. We require a committee to evaluate the merits of such a Program, their task would include the following:

How to honor these individuals. One possibility could be a statute in the Memorial Gardens. Fountain? Wall? etc. A second alternative would be to name a Room, Hall, Building, Courts, and Pavilion in their names. We are sure there may be many new ideas. At the present time there is a plaque in the pool room honoring Jim Berger. At the shuffleboard building there is a plaque honoring Alfie and in the clubhouse there is a plaque honoring Tom Boniface for being “Santa” in the Park for many years.

How should the names be approved? One suggestion could be a committee of past presidents. Would they just need a majority vote or would it require unanimous approval. Should it require BOD or membership approval on both?

Another Awards Program that should be considered is a “Resident of the Month”. Any resident that has done a good deed for the Park or led an activity that should be recognized in a special way could be considered. Awards could include a special parking spot, special table at functions, or badges. Again, the Committee will have other suggestions. What would be the criteria and how would the names be approved? Consideration should be given to have The Social Club lead the process but should the BOD or membership approve the names?

PROPOSAL TO EVALUATE THE NEED FOR A NEW SWIMMING POOL OR AS AN ALTERNATIVE A LAP POOL

The present pool is old and is not large enough to meet the needs of our Park. There are a number of occasions when there is overcrowding during the busy season. In addition the restricted shallow end limits the number of participants in the Exercise Programs.

There are a number of members who would like to swim laps and this conflicts with those members who prefer to just “bob” in the pool. As we are faced with resurfacing the deck at the pool, and considering the alternative of a Lap Swimming Pool it may be the time to develop the feasibility of a new pool which would be large enough to incorporate lanes for swimming laps.

We would like to create a Committee of interested residents who would undertake this evaluation. Some of the issues to be developed include the following:

- Capital and Operating Cost
- Layout of the site
- Type of pool construction including the deck
- Timing and schedule of pool closure/construction

If the new pool is not feasible then consideration should be given to a Lap Pool.

What is a Lap Pool?

It is a pool approximately 10 feet wide and forty feet long with a uniform depth of 3.5 to 4 feet. It is marked with swimming lanes.

What is Required?

A group of residents who would perform the following tasks:

- a. Develop the capital and operating costs
- b. Consider possible sites
- c. Determine if there is sufficient interest to obtain approval for this project

When the analysis is complete it will be reviewed by the Planning and Budget Committee. It would then be presented to the BOD for approval and taken to membership for final approval. If approved, either this group or another director will be required to obtain bids for the work and supervise the installation.

If you are interested in joining this group, would you advise the office or any FFPOA official?

PINEAPPLE ANGEL LUSH

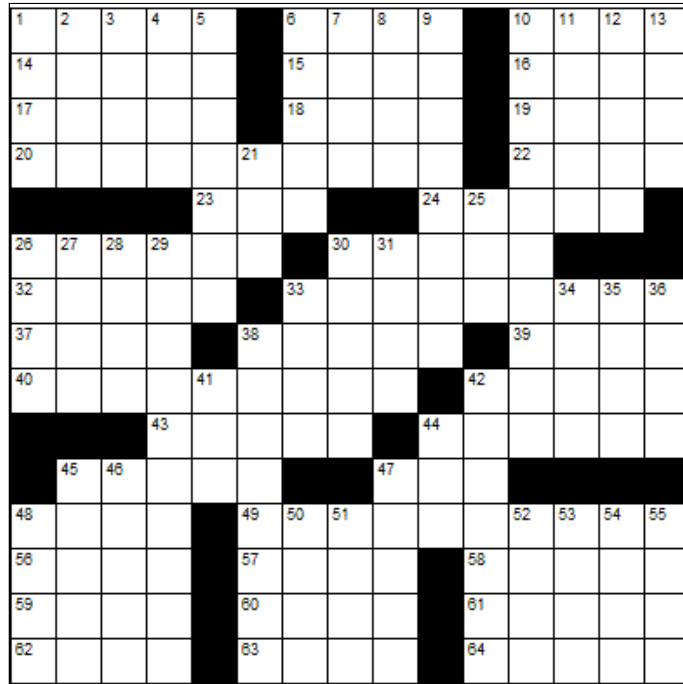

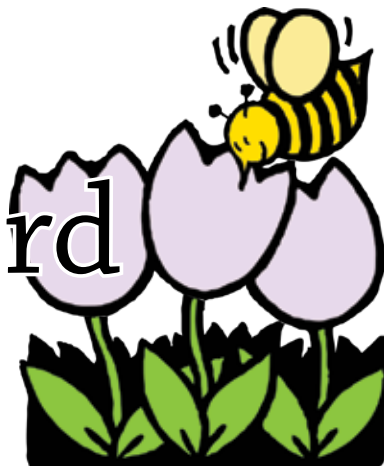

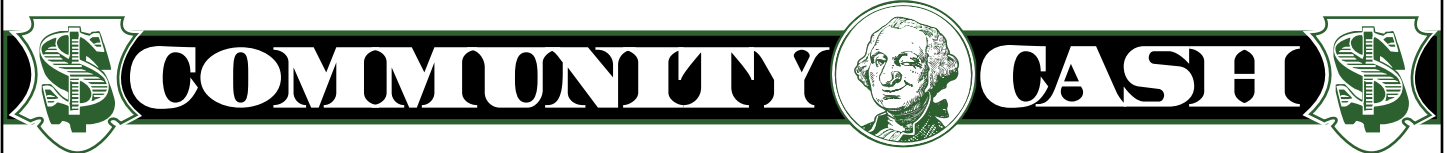
