NOTICE TO LEE COUNTY UTILITIES CUSTOMERS

When I went to the Lee County Utilities web-site to turn off my water for the summer, I saw the notification below. Have a nice summer! Cliff & Sue Brant.

NOTICE TO LEE COUNTY UTILITIES CUSTOMERS Lee County Utilities will be temporarily converting its disinfectant process from chloramines to free chlorine residuals from May 1st through May 29th, 2014.

This is a routine measure that is common for water utilities using chloramines as its primary disinfectant.

Anyone who uses a kidney dialysis machine at home should contact his or her equipment supplier so the proper filtering equipment may be installed.

Tropical fish or aquatic animal owners should contact a local tropical fish store for appropriate pretreatment of water before adding water to tanks.

Customers may notice a temporary change in the taste, odor, and color of the water, which is not harmful.

Again, this is a routine precautionary measure to ensure

our customers of clean, safe potiable water. Please feel free to contact our office during regular business hours at 239-533-8845, if you have any questions.

MAINTENANCE FEE LATE CHARGES EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2014 By: Diane Price

If you pay your maintenance fees by the month:

All maintenance fees are due on the first of each month. If you are thirty (30) days past due, you will be notified by the Board and a delinquent charge of \$5.00 will be added to your account. If the account becomes forty five (45) days past due, the Board will send a certified letter stating that you have ten (10) days to pay in full or a lien will be placed upon your property.

Example: Your monthly payment is due on April 1st. On April 30th your account is past due. On May 1st, you will be charged a late fee of \$5.00.

This action has become necessary in fairness to the majority of property owners that keep their account current. The delinquent charge is assessed in accordance with our Deed of Restrictions. You take the tabs off and bag them; when you get your bag full; then you can bring the tabs to the clubhouse. There is a Big Ronald Mc Donald cardboard house on the kitchen cabinet where you put your tabs into it. The tabs are collected by Betty Campbell who takes them to the Ronald McDonald House where they sell the aluminum


