HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS FOR RESIDENTS OF FOREST PARK

The Activity Building and Clubhouse will be open 8 hours prior to any coming hurricane for you to bring your supplies in and get settled. You will be required to sign a form indicating that you understand the Clubhouse and Activity Buildings are NOT certified hurricane shelters and that you stay in the buildings at your own risk.

Supplies are a critical part of your health and safety and should be gathered in advance of the hurricane.

FOOD - Bring a 3-day supply of non-perishable food that requires no refrigeration and needs little or no water to prepare. The following are suggestions: dry cereal, canned fruit, canned juice, instant coffee and tea, readyto-eat soups, peanut butter, canned vegetables, ready-toeat meats, tuna, chicken, Vienna sausages, bread, crackers and quick energy snacks, etc.

PETS - Pets will be housed in the Activity Building only. You must have a crate and the pet must remain crated at all times. You must stay with your pet at all times and are responsible for care and clean up. NO PETS OVER 35 LBS. NO EXCEPTIONS. PETS WILL BE WEIGHED. Bring a 3-day supply of food and water. Medications and proof of necessary shots are required.

WATER - One gallon per person per day, enough for 3 days.

MISC. - Manual can opener, utility knife, cooler.

COMMUNICATION ITEMS - Cell phone & charger & radio with batteries.

CLOTHING - 1 change per person, rain gear, work clothes/gloves and shoes.

PERSONAL HYGIENE ITEMS - Soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste & brush, etc.

BEDDING - Sleeping bag, blanket & pillow.

HEALTH & SAFETY - Flashlight & plenty of batteries.

FIRST AID KIT - Sunscreen, bug repellent, essential



medication and Medicare and insurance papers, extra eyeglasses/contacts & prescriptions, update on vaccinations (particularly tetanus), trash bags.

DOCUMENTS - Store in safe, secure location, such as a safe deposit box. If you bring copies with you, place them in airtight and watertight storage/freezer bags.

MARGUERITE E. SOUCEK

Marguerite E. (Dee) Soucek, of North Fort Myers, went to her heavenly home on Tuesday, July 8, 2014 at age 97. She was born Oct. 26, 1916 to Susie & Alex King of Ocqueoc, MI. She was a life-long member of the Methodist Church having been baptized as an infant in the rural Methodist Church that her father supplied the lumber for and helped build. She was a member of the United Methodist Church in Fort Myers.

Marguerite graduated from the Onaway High School in Onaway, MI in 1933 and after graduation was employed in local retail stores. Later she moved to Detroit, MI where she was employed in secretarial work and where she met & married her husband Jim. They enjoyed boating, golfing, fishing, hunting and time spent at their "Cabin on the Rainy River."

In Detroit they became involved in fraternal work by joining the Order of Eastern Star in 1959, and where they served as Worthy Matron & Worthy Patron in 1965-66.

Marguerite was elected President of Wayne County Association in 1967 and then appointed Grand Martha of the State of Michigan for the year 1968-69. In 1973 they moved to Florida where they continued their fraternal work by joining Loyalty Chapter OES in Cape Coral as dual members in 1975, and where Marguerite received her 50 year OES membership pin in 2010. They also joined Lee Court #9 Order of the Amaranth in 1975 and where Marguerite served as Royal Matron in 1978-79. She served as Grand Marshal in the west in 1979-80 and was elected to the Grand Line in 1980- serving as Grand Royal Matron of the State of Florida in 1983-84.

She has served on many Grand Court and Supreme Court Council Committees and in 1996-97 was appointed as a Supreme Floor officer.

In 1975 she also joined White Shrine #26 (now Fort Myers Shrine) where she served as Worthy High Priestess in 2000-01. She has remained active in all 3 organizations. Marguerite was also a member of Social Order of Beauseant- joining in Orlando, FL in 1983.

Life in Florida was made enjoyable by her fraternal work and living in Forest Park in North Fort Myers with many caring friends and neighbors.

Marguerite was preceded in death by her husband Jim in 1992; Brothers Hugh & Norman; Sisters Alice & Fern. She is survived by her Sisters Arleen & Barbara, both of Michigan; 1 step-son; 5 step-grandchildren; many nieces & nephews; fraternal associates; and loyal neighbors.

The article below is for your information only:

Facebook just announced a new feature to its app, which will let it listen to our conversations through our own phones' microphone. Talk about a Big Brother move.

Facebook says the feature will be used for harmless things, like identifying the song or TV show playing in the background, but it actually has the ability to listen to everything -- including your private conservations -- and store it indefinitely.

Not only is this move just downright creepy, **it's also a massive threat to our privacy.** This isn't the first time Facebook has been criticized for breaching our right to privacy, and it's hoping this feature will fly under the radar. No such luck for Facebook. If we act now, we can stop Facebook in its tracks before it has a chance to release the feature.

<u>Tell Facebook not to release its creepy and dangerous</u> <u>new app feature that listens to users' conversations.</u> Facebook says it'll be responsible with this feature, **but we know we can't trust it.** After all, just a few months ago Facebook came under fire for receiving millions of dollars for working with the National Security Agency's PRISM, a wide-scale and highly controversial public electronic data surveillance program -- something its CEO Mark Zuckerberg initially denied. This is also the company that lied about its now-scattered Beacon program -- an advertisement system that sent our "private" data from external websites to Facebook.

It seems like every few months, there's another big Facebook privacy scandal, and yet the social media giant is pushing this new app anyway. Why? The information it gathers by listening to its 1.2 billion users worldwide can be sold for huge profits to advertisers and corporations looking for better information on consumer tastes and preferences.

Facebook is acting in the best interests of its bank account, not its users. This has gone too far -- we have to stop it now.

Facebook: This is an extreme invasion of your users' privacy. Do not release this new feature, and do not listen to us through our phones' microphones.
