FOREST PARK VETERAN'S FLAG PROGRAM

The Veteran's flag donation program will be modeled after a very successful program being used by the Massachusetts National Cemetery.

We will accept donations of Veteran's casket flags in memory of a deceased Veteran, or a new flag in honor of a living Veteran.

If you purchase a flag, you are advised to buy a 5'x 9' or 5' x 8' all weather American flag.

Flags will be flown over Forest Park and will be rotated with others. The length of the cycle will be determined by the number of flags received.

As the flags are received, they will be assigned a number and be rotated in numerical order.

Flags will be stored, cared for and flown with all due respect in accordance with the United States flag laws and regulations.

All flags will be displayed until they are no longer serviceable, at which time they will be properly disposed of according to regulations.

MEET YOUR BOARD MEMBERS

As we near conclusion of our Meet Your Board Members series, today I introduce you to Judy Birkhead, more properly known as, Dr. Judith Birkhead, Ph.D.

Louisville, Kentucky is hometown to this nine year Forest Park resident who lives at 604 Pine Grove Court. She has been a board member for the past three years and currently serves as Director of our Swimming Pool & By-Laws Committees.

Judy retired after being employed for over 31 years by the Jefferson Co. Board of Education of Louisville. She attended six different universities, receiving degrees from three and educational certifications from three.

From University of Louisville she received Chemistry, Biology and Natural Sciences degrees; from Western Kentucky University (where she received her Master's Degree): Psychology, Sociology, Guidance & Counseling and School Administration Degrees along with Lifetime Certifications.

She earned half her Doctoral Degree at the Ohio State University where she was a Ford Scholar (one of 12 nationwide), and was a Danforth Scholar and President's Scholar at the University of Cincinnati where she received her Doctor of Education and Ph.D. in Education, Psychology, Sociology, School Administration, Guidance and Counseling.

In high school she sponsored Future Teachers of America, Future Medical Association, and, coached boys and girl's tennis teams and cheerleaders. In 1971, she was head chaperone for girls in the National Junior Olympics in Ithica, N.Y.

She has received special awards from the American Chemical Assn. and the U.S. Marines & Navy and was selected to Who's Who in America. Representing the Governor of Kentucky, she spoke before 30,000 people in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, on Nutritional Education, and, in Dallas, Texas, where she spoke on Salary Structures to 60,000 attendees at the National Association of Secondary Principals.

What she likes most about living here is, "the wonderful people and our beautiful park." When asked about any park changes, she shared, "We should always look for improvements to be presented to membership for approval, but I'm especially interested in maintaining what we have in an excellent manner."

Regarding her life's philosophies, Judy offered, "Treat others as you want to be treated and remember that knowledge is more powerful than force, or, the tongue."

Asked if she had anything to add, she replied, "My desire is to run for re-election to the board in January

as I hope to continue serving our residents - as well as the needs of our park - in a most positive and productive manner."

Next time you see Judy, please say hello and thank her for the great job she and the others continue to do in conducting our Forest park business.
