Things I learned from Fort Myers Pest Control

At their Koffee Klatsch presentation, I learned about Food Rats

Rats like to congregate where there is food. People who have bird feeders and those who feed any animal at their home site who are putting out food on the ground. This is a call for the rats to visit.

If you have a fruit tree in your yard and when the fruit drops, please pick up the fruit and throw away.. The rats like to eat fruit.

Feral Cats are coming in the park Do Not Feed Them. All Cats tend to congregate in one spot where there will be food given to them. Thus - Boy cats who mark their territory and girl cats get together and make lots of noise.

For Those People who cruise or on tours.

Bed Bugs can be prevented by taking your dirty clothes out of the suitcase and put them directly into the dryer for 30 min. Put your suitcase in a plastic bag and leave it outside for 2 days in the sun.

They have certified people; an Entomologist, Lawn and Oriental specialist who does native plants and Termite inspector. They also have a special rate for Forest Park Residents.

There are 2 types of main entry doors for our buildings, "Manual" and "Handicapped." The handicapped doors should only be operated using the automatic pad, and not manually forced open. The doors operate on magnetic locks and timers which can malfunction if improperly forced open or propped open. Your cooperation is appreciated.

NO SOLICITING

The most frequent violators include companies which sell water/water purification systems, tree trimming services, telephone/cable/internet services, and air conditioning companies. These companies may offer free services, such as water quality testing, A/C check, etc. Another tactic they employ is implying that they provided a service in the past to you or to your neighbors, or that they are conducting a survey.

Residents are encouraged to never open the door if you do not recognize the individual. Tell the individual through the window that they are trespassing and must leave immediately. If they do not leave, please call the Lee County Sheriff (non-emergency number) at 239-477-1000. The Sheriff will come out and escort them off of the property.

WI FI UPDATE

The Forest Park WI-FI was installed in 2009. The WI-FI provides user access to their Email banking, Facebook, etc. Previously, if you wanted to watch a movie, Netflix would send you a disk, or you would have cable TV or a landphone line system, (like "Prism").

It is now 2016 and the internet world has changed. Our WI-FI system have seen many changes. We updated our existing 2.4GHz system with the latest antennas, installed very expensive fiber optics, and we added new equipment in the clubhouse.

We are starting to install the newer 5 GHz systems. All new users will be on this system, and anyone who wants to upgrade by replacing their antenna. The existing 2.4 GHz system will remain and most users will have no need to upgrade.

When we began the WiFi service, we had 50 users. Now we have over 220 users on the system . Over Christmas we will have over 300.The daily usage of our system is over 100 Gigabytes, which means that our ...continued on page 10

This brings up the sensitive subject of extreme use of our Wi-Fi system, which effects all users on the system. If you have satellite TV, you are able to connect to our Wi-Fi to down load or watch programs and movies. This effects all users on our system.

After the holiday we will be testing to find out how much effect downloading or streaming a Netflix movie, or watching a past show, has on our system. We can then better determine what the effect this usage will have on our system.

We are asking, during the busy season, everyone to avoid extra usage of our system, and to ask your guest to do the same. After hours, 10:00 PM, when users drop off, then it's OK.

Use Caution in Hiring Contractors!

When you need to hire a contractor for work on your home (roofing, home repairs, lawn maintenance, etc.), ask the contractor to provide copies of their business license and insurance. This protects you in the event that the contractor is injured on your property. Also ask the contractor to provide references. Get cost estimates and warranties in writing, and do not make final payment until the work is complete. There is a Resource Book in the back of the Clubhouse which contains listings for many different types of contractors. You may also check Angie's List, the Better Business Bureau and other online rating sources. A simple Google search on the business name may provide additional information. Pease ask any outside contractor to stop by the office to register and provide copies of their license and insurance. Better safe than sorry!
