NO SOLICITING

Forest Park has a clear non-solicitation policy posted at the front of the community. However, there are several companies that persist in soliciting our residents. Unfortunately, there have been situations where residents have been taken advantage of by solicitors.

The most frequent violators include companies which sell water/water purification systems, tree trimming services, telephone/cable/internet services, and air conditioning companies. These companies may offer free services, such as water quality testing, A/C check, etc. Another tactic they employ is implying that they provided a service in the past to you or to your neighbors, or that they are conducting a survey.

Residents are encouraged to never open the door if you do not recognize the individual. Tell the individual through the window that they are trespassing and must leave immediately. If they do not leave, please call the Lee County Sheriff (non-emergency number) at 239-477-1000. The Sheriff will come out and escort them off of the property.



WI FI UPDATE

When Park residents take advantage of the new technology built into "Smart" TVs, or with added devices like Roku, Comcast, Amazon Fire etc., that turn a regular TV into a "Smart" TV, and connect to the Park's Wi-Fi, there is adverse impact on our band width. In many cases, settings can be changed to lower the impact on our Wi-Fi system. For instance downloads could be scheduled at night and at a lower definition. Please read the manuals that come with these devices. We are seeing that some individuals are each using 15 to 20% of the Park's band width. See Example below for latest usage.



Use Caution in Hiring Contractors!

When you need to hire a contractor for work on your home (roofing, home repairs, lawn maintenance, etc.), ask the contractor to provide copies of their business license and insurance. This protects you in the event that the contractor is injured on your property. Also ask the contractor to provide references. Get cost estimates and warranties in writing, and do not make final payment until the work is complete. There is a Resource Book in the back of the Clubhouse which contains listings for many different types of contractors. You may also check Angie's List, the Better Business Bureau and other online rating sources. A simple Google search on the business name may provide additional information. Pease ask any outside contractor to stop by the office to register and provide copies of their license and insurance. Better safe than sorry! PLEASE RECYCLE THE FOLLOWING:

- Aluminum Empty cans and aluminum foil.
- Corrugated cardboard boxes Please flatten, and either cut down or fold to a size of no more than 4' X 4' flattened. Staples and tape do not have to be removed.
- Glass Clear & color food and beverage jars and bottles. Please rinse and remove food and other contents. Labels, rings and lids on glass containers are acceptable.
- Juice cartons All drink boxes and milk/juice cartons.
- Magazines Including catalogs and printed material with glossy pages.
- Mixed paper Brown paper bags, junk mail, envelopes, copier paper, pizza boxes, cardboard egg cartons, paper towel & toilet paper rolls, cereal and shoe boxes.
- Newspapers Includes all paper that is distributed with or as part of general circulation newspapers.
- Plastics With the recycling symbol Recycle #1-2 PET and HDPE containers such as beverage bottles, dishwashing soap bottles, shampoo bottles, plastic milk jugs, and detergent bottles.
- Steel and tin cans Please rinse or remove contents (empty aerosol cans are OK too).
- Telephone books

HELPFUL RECYCLING TIPS

- Please do NOT place any recyclables in plastic bags.
- All clean recyclables may be placed together loosely in the same bin or cart.
- Separating newspapers is not required, but newspapers can be placed in brown paper bags (no plastic bags please).
- If your recycle bin is full, put excess recyclables into brown paper bags.
- Plastic bags and Styrofoam containers can be recycled at local grocery stores with designated recycling bins.
- Fluorescent light bulbs can be recycled at a major home improvement store.
- Place yard waste at curb for the scheduled Wednesday pick up only. Please use a cart or can for loose cuttings, avoid using plastic bags. Paper yard waste bags are available at local hardware stores.

DID YOU KNOW?

Plastic Bags are NOT recyclable.

They clog the separating system and are the leading contamination issue that cause loads to end up in the landfill. Please do not put recyclables into plastic bags.

Trash, Horticulture & Waste Disposal Reminder....



Just a refresher on our Rules & Regulations for trash, horticulture and waste disposal...

- Trash bags which weigh more than 30 lbs. will not be picked up.
- Trash bags must be tied or they will not be picked up.

- Horticulture bags must be tied or they will not be picked up.
- Loose horticulture clippings must be 4 feet or less, tied & bundled & not more than 30 lbs.
- Cardboard should go out on Wednesdays with recyclables.
- Any outside contractor doing work at your hometree trimming, lawn maintenance, home remodeling/ repairs MUST haul off their own trimming and refuse. It will not be picked up by our maintenance crew.

The blue barrel is used for all other types of re-cycling such as paper, metal, plastic, etc. This is a separate Program from our regular trash that is picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays. The re-cycle truck comes on Wednesdays.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to approve the initiative to have all residents place paint, pesticides, chemicals, florescent bulbs and gas bottles at curbside.

Park employees will pick up these materials on Tuesday and Friday and log them in. These articles will be stored and disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members.

The rules and regulations have been changed to reflect the process.



FACTS ABOUT YOUR MONEY....


- U.S. paper money is not paper at all: Its 75% cotton and 25% linen. In Benjamin Franklin's day, people repaired torn bills with a needle and thread.
- Today, the Fed prefers to shred. Every month, the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia sends 16 tons of old, cut-up cash to an energy-from-waste plant in Chester, Pennsylvania, to be burned; the resulting steam produces electricity to power homes through the Delaware Valley.
- Most paper money never sees puberty. With a life span of about 4 ½ years, the \$10 bill is our shortest-lived note. Our longest-living, the \$100 bill, lasts only 15 years.
- It takes about 4,000 double folds (first forward and then backwards) before a bill will tear. It takes far fewer folds for a snooty vending machine to reject your bill, but you can fix that by popping your Washington in the microwave for about 20 seconds to crisp it up.
- The U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing prints 32.2 million currency notes each day, with a face value of approximately \$907.8 million.
- Two-dollar bills are seen as a rarity, but there are more than 1.1 billion of them in circulation. You can find them at most local banks.
- The largest note ever made was the \$100,000 Gold Certificate (printed December 1934 through January 1935). The bills were used only in transactions between Federal Reserve banks and the U.S. Treasury.
- A quarter has 119 grooves around its edge; a dime has 118. The grooves were added to make it different for people to file down the edges and sell the shavings as precious metals.
- It cost more than a penny to make a penny. According to the U.S. Mint, it costs roughly 1.7 cents per coin.
- Benjamin Franklin reportedly designed the first U.S. penny, in 1787. Instead of "E Pluribus Unum," it proudly stated, "Mind Your Business."
- The bald eagle on your money may have a name. From 1830 to 1836, a certain bird swooped into Philadelphia's U.S. Mint building so often that workers named him Peter the Mint Eagle, cared for him. And allegedly used him as a model for coin engravings for year after.
