#### **Use Caution in Hiring Contractors!**

When you need to hire a contractor for work on your home (roofing, home repairs, lawn maintenance, etc.), ask the contractor to provide copies of their business license and insurance. This protects you in the event that the contractor is injured on your property. Also ask the contractor to provide references. Get cost estimates and warranties in writing, and do not make final payment until the work is complete. There is a Resource Book in the back of the Clubhouse which contains listings for many different types of contractors. You may also check Angie's List, the Better Business Bureau and other online rating sources. A simple Google search on the business name may provide additional information. Pease ask any outside contractor to stop by the office to register and provide copies of their license and insurance. Better safe than sorry! ## IMPORTANT RECYCLE REMINDER FROM WASTE PRO

Please do not place any plastic bags in your recycle container. Plastic bags should be placed in your regular trash bins or dropped off at grocery stores which recycle (see below for additional information). Thank you for your cooperation!

#### PLEASE RECYCLE THE FOLLOWING:

- Aluminum Empty cans and aluminum foil.
- Corrugated cardboard boxes Please flatten, and either cut down or fold to a size of no more than 4' X 4' flattened. Staples and tape do not have to be removed
- Glass Clear & color food and beverage jars and bottles. Please rinse and remove food and other contents. Labels, rings and lids on glass containers are acceptable.
- Juice cartons All drink boxes and milk/juice cartons.
- Magazines Including catalogs and printed material with glossy pages.
- Mixed paper Brown paper bags, junk mail, envelopes, copier paper, pizza boxes, cardboard egg cartons, paper towel & toilet paper rolls, cereal and shoe boxes.
- Newspapers Includes all paper that is distributed with or as part of general circulation newspapers.
- Plastics With the recycling symbol Recycle #1-2 PET and HDPE containers such as beverage bottles, dishwashing soap bottles, shampoo bottles, plastic milk jugs, and detergent bottles.
- Steel and tin cans Please rinse or remove contents (empty aerosol cans are OK too).
- Telephone books

#### ITEMS THAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED

- Ceramics
- Christmas lights
- Coat hangers
- Computers, printers or other office equipment
- Electric cords
- Garden hoses

- Household items Cooking pots & pans, toasters, etc.

- Light bulbs (incandescent or fluorescent)
- Mirrors
- · Plastic bags
- Plastics Unnumbered or without recycle symbol
- Porcelain
- Styrofoam Egg cartons, food containers, or packing material
- Window or auto glass

#### HELPFUL RECYCLING TIPS

- Please do NOT place any recyclables in plastic bags.
- All clean recyclables may be placed together loosely in the same bin or cart.
- eparating newspapers is not required, but newspapers can be placed in brown paper bags (no plastic bags please).
- If your recycle bin is full, put excess recyclables into brown paper bags.
- Plastic bags and Styrofoam containers can be recycled at local grocery stores with designated recycling bins.
- Fluorescent light bulbs can be recycled at a major home improvement store.
- Place yard waste at curb for the scheduled Wednesday pick up only. Please use a cart or can for loose cuttings, avoid using plastic bags. Paper yard waste bags are available at local hardware stores.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

Plastic Bags are NOT recyclable.

They clog the separating system and are the leading contamination issue that cause loads to end up in the landfill. Please do not put recyclables into plastic bags.

Paper or Plastic? No Thanks! Take reusable bags with you every time you go shopping.

#### FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS



Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands using park recreational when

facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.). The wristbands are now available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along.

Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules & Regulations. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation to assist in maintaining the security of our park.

#### Trash, Horticulture & Waste Disposal Reminder....

Just a refresher on our Rules & Regulations for trash, horticulture and waste disposal...

- Trash bags which weigh more than 30 lbs. will not be picked up.
- Trash bags must be tied or they will not be picked
- Horticulture bags must be tied or they will not be picked up.
- Loose horticulture clippings must be 4 feet or less, tied & bundled & not more than 30 lbs.
- Cardboard should go out on Wednesdays with recyclables.
- Any outside contractor doing work at your home tree trimming, lawn maintenance, home remodeling/ repairs MUST haul off their own trimming and refuse. It will not be picked up by our maintenance crew

#### HAZARDOUS WASTE

Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to approve the initiative to have all residents place paint, pesticides, chemicals, florescent bulbs and gas bottles at curbside.

Park employees will pick up these materials on Tuesday and Friday and log them in. These articles will be stored and disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members.




#### GREEN TREE STICKER

#### HEALTH AND WELLNESS

So many of the 'healthy' packaged goodies and snacks you're getting from the supermarket every week, may be loaded with additives that can put your health at risk.

Most of us only check for carbs, fat, and calories while paying no attention to the flavor enhancers, which are labgenerated chemicals made to boost sales and cut costs for manufacturers. Unfortunately, the foods that can't make you fat can probably kill you!!

CHECK OUT THESE 9 MOST DANGEROUS ADDITIVES THAT YOU ABSOLUTELY NEED TO STOP EATING:

- 1. Partially Hydrogenated Oil
- 2. High-Fructose Corn Syrup
- 3. MSG
- 4. Sodium Nitrate and Sodium Nitrite
- 5. BHA (Butylated Hydroxyanisole) and BHT(Butylated Hydroxytoluene
- 6. Propyl Gallate
- 7. Potassium Bromate
- 8. Sodium Benzoate and Benzoic Acid
- 9. Food Colorings

Each month I will focus on 1 or 2 of the additives. This month I will start with Partially Hydrogenated Oil. This ingredient is mainly used to prolong shelf life and stabilize flavor. Partially hydrogenated oil is the primary source of trans fats, which the body finds very difficult to dissolve, moreover, they increase bad cholesterol and have been proven to be active agents of cellular deterioration, nutritional deficiencies, diabetes, and heart disease. You should avoid all foods that consist of trans fat, such as margarine, chips, salad dressings, cookies, crackers, and vegetable shortening.

#### **Easy Loaded Omelet Muffins**

- 3 TB diced onion
- 3 TB diced red bell pepper
- 2 oz. shredded cheddar cheese
- Or you can add whatever you like.

Directions: Preheat the oven to 350F. Spray the muffin tins with cooking spray. In a large bowl whisk the eggs and egg whites, season with salt and pepper. Mix in the remaining ingredients. Place tins on a cookie sheet and bake 20 to 25 minutes, until set. Makes 12 muffins.
