GET A HEAD START ON SPRING CLEANING

Exterior Cleaning

Free wellness mini-checkup (blood pressure, pulse, and cholesterol screening) and a small gift for donors. Please support our blood drive....it can save lives right here in our community!!

****Did you know the benefits of donating blood?**

****Your may be less likely to have a heart attack..**

****Donating regularly may help your blood flow and result in fewer arterial blockages. In fact, some studies have shown that men who donate at least three times a year can drastically reduce their risk of having a heart attack or stroke.**

****Donating can keep you iron level balanced. Having too much iron in your blood can contribute to hardening of the arteries. When you donate blood, the amount of iron in your blood is reduced. The iron will be replenished by the food you eat after donating, but regular donations can balance your iron level.**

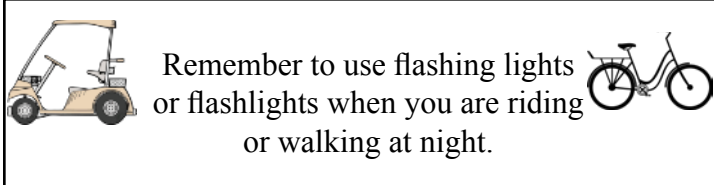

WI-FI

Forest Park WI-FI was started in 2009 as a way for our residences to receive emails and local news and look at short videos. Since that time, we have made major upgrades to our hardware and improved our internet line feed. We currently have over 200 users on our system and they use up to 200Gb of data each day. Our current system has great difficulty in handling the traffic of a Smart TV, Hulu, Netflix, etc. Presently, every day, the top 15 users are consuming one half of the data. If all the other users consumed at that rate the system would be overpowered. SO, if you are just moving in or bought a new Smart TV and want to use all the new features, it could overload the system, and it would run very slowly. This applies whether you have a 2.4 GHz or 5 GHz antenna and would affect all users. (5 GHz units are less affected by background noise than the 2.4 GHz units, but will not guarantee your ability to get INTERNET TV). When the snowbirds have left, there will be less of an issue for summer residents, because of the reduced load on the system.

This is what we are going to do to improve the system.

1. We are going to add 2 more 5 GHz antennas this winter.

2. When our contract is up this fall, we expect to be able to add more fiber capacity.

We have started negotiations with another supplier on this already.

With added bandwidth, the system will be GREATLY improved, but it will still not allow 200 users to stream at the same time.

SWEETHEART IMPOSTERS TURN UP THE HEAT ON SWFL RESIDENTS

The Lee County Sheriff's Office Economic Crimes Unit is warning residents – particularly seniors – to guard their hearts and their wallets from scammers posing as online love interests in what is commonly known as the “romance scam”.

Over the last several weeks, the fraud line has received an increase in calls from concerned family members reporting con-artists posing as the perfect partner in order to lure unsuspecting victims into fraudulent relations through the use of popular social media and internet dating sites. Despite the expertise in deception and draining bank accounts these cybercriminals possess, the tips below can help detect whether or not that new sweetheart is a dream or a nightmare:

*** If you receive a “friend” request from someone you do not know and they quickly want to develop a relationship, be suspicious. Too much, too fast can lead to disaster.

***If this new “person” quickly urges you to move your conversations off of Facebook or an online dating service and onto other messaging platforms, be suspicious. Not only does this help them organize their conversations with multiple victims, it also allows them to take down their phony online profile before you discover it.

***Scammers generally claim to be from the United States but just happen to be overseas for business or family matters, are deployed in the military, working in “mining” fields or the “construction” industry, or on an oil rig.

***Ironically, you have many things in common with your new “friend”, such as the loss of a spouse, child, or parent. In fact, it's nearly unbelievable how your lives seem to be so relatable. This alone should raise your suspicions.

***Cybercriminals are patient. As your fairytale romance progresses and you are now emotionally involved, it will be time for them to pounce. You will be asked for money to help pay for travel costs so the two of you can meet, help pay a medical bill or assist with a financial difficulty.

The romance scam is a billion-dollar internet scheme that entraps victims of all ages and can cause long-term effects both financially and emotionally. If you think you've been or are being scammed, contact the sheriff's office fraud line at 239-258-3292, or ic3.gov.

FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS

Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.). The wristbands are now available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along.

Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules & Regulations. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation to assist in maintaining the security of our park.



GREEN TREE STICKER

There is a little green tree sticker available in the office that goes on the **LEFT SIDE OF YOUR BACK WINDOW** of your car. All residents with automobiles should have this highly visible authorization to be in the Park. This will help the safety patrol on their nightly rounds. If you are temporary resident and don't want any stickers on your window, then scotch tape it there while you are here.



We have received complaints regarding residents walking their dogs and not picking up after them. Kindly pick up after your dog. If you walk your dog at night, please carry a flashlight and a doggy bag and clean up after your pet.

Dog feces are unsightly and are health hazards. Please be considerate of your neighbors. (If you observe someone not picking up after their pet, you may remind them to do so, or take a photo of the person and contact the office.)

RECYCLE BLUE BIN

The blue bin is used for all *other types* of re-cycling such as paper, metal, plastic, etc. This is a separate Program from our regular trash that is picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays. The re-cycle truck comes on Wednesdays.

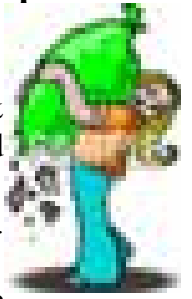

Trash, Horticulture & Waste Disposal Reminder....



Just a refresher on our Rules & Regulations for trash, horticulture and waste disposal...

- Trash bags which weigh more than 30 lbs. will not be picked up.
- Trash bags must be tied or they will not be picked up.
- Horticulture bags must be tied or they will not be picked up.
- Loose horticulture clippings must be 4 feet or less, tied & bundled & not more than 30 lbs.
- Cardboard should go out on Wednesdays with recyclables.
- Any outside contractor doing work at your home - tree trimming, lawn maintenance, home remodeling/repairs MUST haul off their own trimming and refuse. It will not be picked up by our maintenance crew.

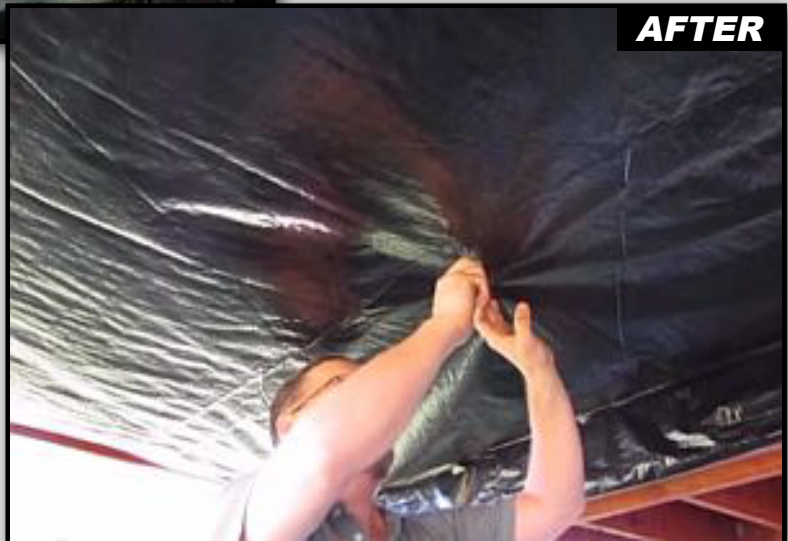

HAZARDOUS WASTE

Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to approve the initiative to have all residents place paint, pesticides, chemicals, florescent bulbs and gas bottles at curbside.

Park employees will pick up these materials on Tuesday and Friday and log them in. These articles will be stored and disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members.

The rules and regulations have been changed to reflect the process.

IMPORTANT RECYCLE REMINDER FROM WASTE PRO

Please do not place any plastic bags in your recycle container. Plastic bags should be placed in your regular trash bins or dropped off at grocery stores which recycle (see below for additional information). Thank you for your cooperation!

PLEASE RECYCLE THE FOLLOWING:

- Aluminum - Empty cans and aluminum foil.
- Corrugated cardboard boxes - Please flatten, and either cut down or fold to a size of no more than 4' X 4' flattened. Staples and tape do not have to be removed.
- Glass - Clear & color food and beverage jars and bottles. Please rinse and remove food and other contents. Labels, rings and lids on glass containers are acceptable.
- Juice cartons – All drink boxes and milk/juice cartons.
- Magazines - Including catalogs and printed material with glossy pages.
- Mixed paper - Brown paper bags, junk mail, envelopes, copier paper, pizza boxes, cardboard egg cartons, paper towel & toilet paper rolls, cereal and shoe boxes.
- Newspapers - Includes all paper that is distributed with or as part of general circulation newspapers.
- Plastics - With the recycling symbol Recycle #1-2 PET and HDPE containers such as beverage bottles, dishwashing soap bottles, shampoo bottles, plastic milk jugs, and detergent bottles.
- Steel and tin cans - Please rinse or remove contents (empty aerosol cans are OK too).
- Telephone books

ITEMS THAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED

- Ceramics
- Christmas lights
- Coat hangers

- Computers, printers or other office equipment
- Electric cords
- Garden hoses
- Glass cookware/bakeware
- Household items - Cooking pots & pans, toasters, etc.
- Light bulbs (incandescent or fluorescent)
- Mirrors
- Plastic bags
- Plastics - Unnumbered or without recycle symbol
- Porcelain
- Styrofoam - Egg cartons, food containers, or packing material

- Window or auto glass

HELPFUL RECYCLING TIPS

- Please do NOT place any recyclables in plastic bags. All clean recyclables may be placed together loosely in the same bin or cart.
- Separating newspapers is not required, but newspapers can be placed in brown paper bags (no plastic bags please).
- If your recycle bin is full, put excess recyclables into brown paper bags.
- Plastic bags and Styrofoam containers can be recycled at local grocery stores with designated recycling bins.
- Fluorescent light bulbs can be recycled at a major home improvement store.
- Place yard waste at curb for the scheduled Wednesday pick up only. Please use a cart or can for loose cuttings, avoid using plastic bags. Paper yard waste bags are available at local hardware stores.

DID YOU KNOW?

Plastic Bags are NOT recyclable.

They clog the separating system and are the leading contamination issue that cause loads to end up in the landfill. Please do not put recyclables into plastic bags.

Paper or Plastic? No Thanks! Take reusable bags with you every time you go shopping.

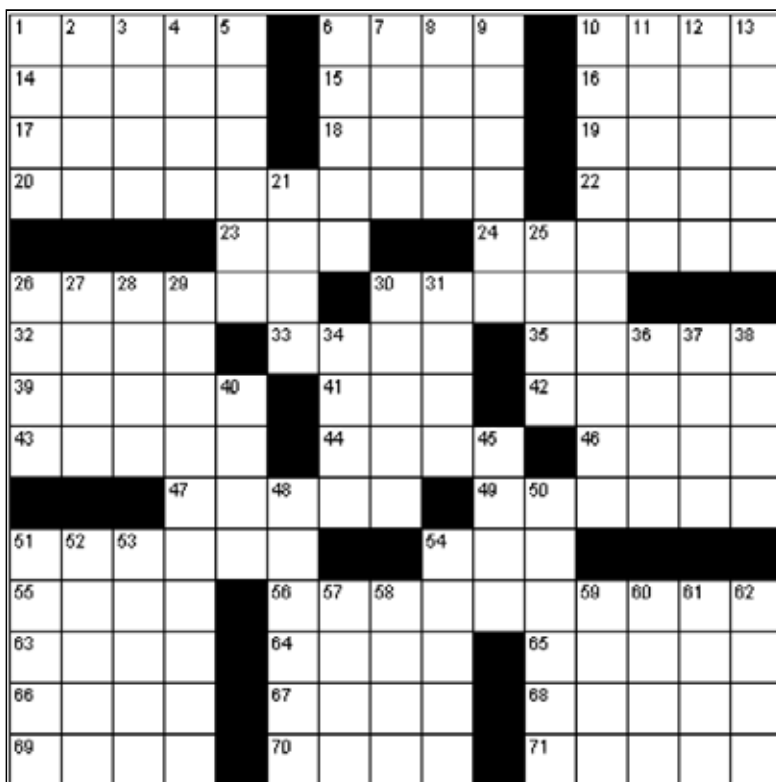
