2019 BUDGET PROPOSAL

The Park's budgeting committee begins the budgeting process for the following year early in the current year. Spending projections are based on history and pending issues. The projections are made based upon three funding approaches:

- Funding for Operating expenses, these are for items like wages, utilities, insurance etc., that recur frequently, (up to at least once per year).
- Funding for Reserve expenses, these expenses are for items that recur infrequently, from years to decades. Examples are, AC units, pool pumps, roofs, road paving etc.
- Funding for Improvements, this fund is for amenities that we currently do not have but would like to have. Or, for making significant improvements in existing amenities, to keep up with the changing expectations of park residents.

The spending projections must fit the projected income, which, nowadays, comes almost entirely from maintenance fees. Our annual maintenance fee adjustment is related to the change in Consumer Price Index. We wait for the CPI data for the 12 months ending at the third quarter to be published, then we calculate the fee increase for next year as the CPI x 1.5, rounded down to the nearest dollar. The government published the endof-September 12 month CPI increase on October 13 as 2.3%. This provides for 2019 fees as indicated below:




