NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

The safety and security of the residents in Forest Park depends on all people living in the park whether residents, snow birds or rental occupants. We should all be observant for situations that appear to deviate from normal resident activities. Persons that do not appear to have a valid reason for being in the park that potentially could lead to vandalism or malicious invasion of property should be reported to the sheriff's office at 477-1000.

Our security not only depends on the security patrol observations but on each individual living in the park. The 911number should be used for immediate emergency needs and the sheriff's office number 477-1000 should be used for observations that suggest crime, invasion of property or unlawful conduct. When either number is used, time is important and action should be initiated quickly. It's better to call and find no action was necessary than not call and have damage or injury occur that could have been prevented if a call had been made.

Signs for display in house windows stating, "neighborhood watch" and emergency phone numbers are available in the office or at upcoming F.P.P.O.A. meetings.

CHEF'S CORNER

BBQ Ribs

Cut baby back ribs into sections. Place in roasting pan. Cover in combination of Montreal Chicken Spice and Cajun Spice powders (both by Club House la Grille). Cover pan with tin foil. Bake for 2 - 3 hours, Dry in oven at 300° F. FYI – I couldn't find the green chilies in oil so used 1 tsp. of green chilies in water from small can of green chilies. BBQ for 5 - 10 minutes, covering with lots of Red Devil Sauce (see below).

Red Devil BBQ Sauce:

cup finely chopped onion $\frac{1}{4}$ 1 tsp. Cayenne pepper $\frac{1}{4}$ cup olive oil 1 tbsp. chili powder 2 cloves garlic, chopped 1 tsp. green chilies in oil (jar) $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups ketchup 1 cup water small tin tomato paste 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup vinegar Cook onions and garlic in oil until soft golden brown. Add all other ingredients, 2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce 2 stir well. Simmer 2 minutes. Serve warm, tsp. salt 1 tbsp. Black pepper or refrigerate and serve cold. * * * * * Orange Pineapple Dessert 2 pkgs. (3 oz. each) sugar-free In a bowl, dissolve gelatin in boiling water.
