#### LEGAL COMMITTEE

The Legal Committee is responsible for reviewing legal matters coming before the FPPOA such as contracts, changes in rules or by laws and miscellaneous matters. They also serve as an administrative review and appeals committee. This includes hearings regarding the building of sheds, additional driveways or other "changes" to your property. In addition, they hear those people who wish to be heard regarding violation letters they have received or other matters on which they wish to be heard. In effect, the Legal Committee serves as a filter for those matters, which would otherwise come before the Board of Directors. Some, they may handle to completion, while others may be referred to the Board with or without a recommendation.

The Construction Committee is a subcommittee of the Legal Committee and oversees any building construction, renovations or modifications to the FPPOA common buildings or grounds.

<u>The Legal Committee is soliciting</u> responses from those who have an interest in such matters for possible future appointment to these Committees.

**Legal Committee:** A legal background is not required. You must however have the ability to view matters coming before the committee in an objective manner leaving out what may be your personal feelings on a particular issue.

**Construction Committee:** This committee meets only on an as needed basis. They need people with a background in building trades, contracts, construction management etc. They will hopefully compile a list of people with particular experience or expertise in certain areas and call upon them as needed.

If we are to run the park properly and efficiently we must have volunteers with a wide range of backgrounds to help us.

We would also urge you to consider running for the Board of Directors in the future. We really need a wide range of experiences on the Board as well. We are one of very few parks who actually manage their parks. Most have management companies who run the parks for upwards of \$100,000 per year for full service management. With your help in volunteering your services and expertise, we can continue to manage, save money and add amenities. Lacking that commitment from our residents, we may very well in the future have to consider professional management services.

#### Lemon Meringue Pie Doris Pecos

Filling

9" baked deep dish pie crust

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup corn starch

1-1/2 cup sugar

2 cups water

5 egg yolks, lightly beaten

½ cup lemon juice

1 tsp grated lemon peel

2 tbls butter

Meringue

5 egg whites

½ cup sugar

2 tsp corn starch

Mix corn starch, sugar, water and egg yolks in saucepan over medium heat. Stirring constantly, bring mixture to a boil (about 8-10 minutes), reduce heat and continue stirring for one minute until very thick. Remove from heat; stir in lemon juice, lemon zest and butter until smooth. Pour hot filling into pie crust.

Beat egg whites in mixer at high speed until soft peaks form; gradually add ½ cup sugar and 2 tsp corn starch, beating until stiff peaks form (tips stand straight), about 3 minutes.

Top pie by spooning meringue over hot pie filling, making sure meringue touches edge of pie crust to seal. Use the back of a spoon to swirl meringue and draw up into peaks.

Place oven rack in bottom third of preheated 375F oven. Bake 10 minutes until peaks are lightly browned. Cool at room temperature for 30 minutes. Chill for a minimum of 3 hours before serving.



Chocolate Delight Shirley Eckert

1 cup flour

1 stick oleo

1 cup chopped nuts

Mix together and press into pan. Bake 20 minutes. at 350 degrees.

8 oz cream cheese

1 cup powder sugar

1 8oz cool whip

Beat together, spread on cooled crust

1 small instant vanilla pudding

1 small instant chocolate pudding

2 1/2 cups milk

Mix together and spread on cream cheese

Top with 8oz cool whip
