

#### TELL ME WHERE TO GO By Lisa Noel

This month I am happy to feature one of Nancy and Peter Giaquinto's favorite places. Nancy and Peter bought their home in Forest Park seven years ago and have lived here



full time for four years. They moved here from Ballston Spa, NY.

Looking for something fun to do these chilly Florida mornings? You may consider a visit to the Lee County Manatee Park. During our warmer months, the manatees can be seen swimming around the Florida coastline, however when the gulf temperatures dip 68 degrees or lower, the manatees need to seek out warmer water to keep their 70 degrees body temperature.

The outflow of water from the nearby Florida Power & Light Station, provides a consistently warm water flow into the channel that runs through this park. The manatees enjoy the warmth and the visitors can get a close up view of these 1,000 lb. mammals from nearby platforms and paths.

Fortunately for us, the manatees need to breath every 3 to 5 minutes, so if they are swimming in that area you won't have to wait long for a sighting. Manatee Park has a long concrete path with chain link fencing that runs along the canal and provides lookout points for manatees. A playground and picnic area offer a perfect spot for families. The Welcome Center offers educational opportunities. For those looking for a peaceful experience there are native plants to see and a butterfly garden in the summer months. Public kayak launch and rentals available. The park charges minimal fees for parking, visitors are free. The park is open daily from 8am until sunset. Pets are not allowed in the park.



#### **RECYCLE BLUE BIN**

Thursday. The recycle truck comes on Fridays.

#### FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS



Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park ool mini-golf etc.)

The wristbands are normally available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along.

Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to approve the initiative to have all residents place paint, pesticides, chemicals, florescent bulbs and gas bottles at curbside.

Park employees will pick up these materials on Tuesday and Friday and log them in. These articles will be stored and disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members.

The rules and regulations have been changed to reflect the process.

#### **GREEN TREE STICKER**

There is a little green tree sticker available in the office that goes on the LEFT SIDE OF YOUR BACK WINDOW of your car. All residents with automobiles should have this highly visible authorization to be in the Park. This will help the safety patrol on their nightly rounds. If you are temporary resident and don't want any stickers on your window, them scotch tape it there while you are here.

#### ALUMINUM CAN RECYCLE By Social Club

REMINDER Aluminum Cans being collected

Please do Not Use the can as an ashtray. Beer Drinkers, please rinse out the can and turn it over to dry out. Please remember to put your aluminum cans in a bag and place <u>UNDER YOUR MAILBOX</u> by 5:00 P.M. MONDAY EVENING for pick up. Please make sure your cans are rinsed CLEAN and DRY. Please place away from trash bags. DO NOT place plastic, glass or metal cans in the bag. Those go in the blue recycle bins.

Money collected for can recycle helps pay some of the costs of Social Club activities. It benefits all residents of Forest Park.



Remember to use flashing lights or flashlights when you are riding or walking at night.



#### WIFI CONTACT INFORMATION By WiFi Committee

An information meeting for members was held on January 5th. Notes from the meeting are posted on the clubhouse board, and



copies are available at the volunteer reception desk in the Activities building.

Technologies

There are presently two technologies capable of providing internet access to Forest Park. Century Link provides DSL service through existing telephone lines. You can query their website, provide your home address and obtain a cost and description of service available. DSL is available up to two miles from the telephone switching station. It available in Forest Park, but homes on the West perimeter are only offered a speed of 3 Mbs. This may be marginal for some users. The cost, with taxes is about \$800 for year-round service.

The other technology is wireless through-the-air, (TTA), which is the park's system. This has radios mounted on a central tower that communicate with a radio mounted at your house. The house unit brings the communication indoors through a cable. This cable can be connected directly to a device, but it usually is connected



to a router which communicates to computers, cell phones and, nowadays, to at least one TV in the house.

#### TTA Distribution

TTA systems are affected by the distance between the tower and the home units, by trees, transformers on poles or other obstacles. We have drawn the park map to scale, (picture below), and a copy is available at the office. You can locate your residence and try to position your home radio so it can "see" the tower.

The park's present TTA system has evolved since inception. It originally consisted of an array of 2.4 Ghz radios and included a portion that relayed transmission from the RV area to the Knotty Pine Circle area. We still have two old, (now obsolete), 2.4 Ghz radios on the clubhouse tower but the RV relay portion failed last summer. The few residents that were connected have changed to 5 Ghz units that easily reach to the clubhouse tower.

Due to inherited connections over time, we currently have about a third of our residents connected to one tower radio. The entire park is now served by seven, 5Ghz units from the clubhouse tower. Five of the seven are newer technology. Our plan is to replace the two, 2.4 Ghz and older technology 5 Ghz radios with 4 newer technology units. This will provide a total of nine, modern 5 Ghz radios. We intend to have these communicate to the park area through narrow azimuth arc antennas strategically directed to areas of the park, to balance the load. This project has not yet been scheduled.

#### TTA Capacity

The current 1000Mbs feed can presently accommodate the overall park demand, - even at peak times. But we are in the first wave of an avalanche of internet TV connections. If we reach saturation, we can purchase more feed, but we first need to balance the distribution.

#### **Clubhouse Wiring**

The wires from the tower radios enter the clubhouse and connect to equipment presently mounted high in the corner. This is difficult to access and we intend to connect and mount it all in a cabinet near the SW entrance door. (Picture mounted on the clubhouse information board).

Costs, In-House vs. Commercial TTA System,

The computer club hopes to be able to contribute about half the cost of the planned WiFi improvements. The 2022 budget for park WiFi works out to about \$41/ year as part of the maintenance fee. This economy is achievable only with volunteers providing local technical service. The system could be operated by a commercial technical company, with users being billed individually. The cost to park customers would be about \$360 for six-month "snowbird" service or \$440 for year-round service. House calls for other than loss of connection would normally be \$100.


added Hope Hospice in respect of family of several of our members and to the Kentucky State Treasurer to help them rebuild their towns. So your donation for the meal goes to a good cause.
