






LAUGH OFTEN

things from my shed. Well, you don't have to worry about them now because I just shot and killed them both; the dogs are eating them right now," and he hung up.




a Helicopter, two Fire Trucks, a Paramedic and an Ambulance showed up at the Phillips residence and caught the burglars red-handed.

LEE COUNTY RECREATION & COMMUNITY CENTERS

Did you know that Lee County has four large recreation and community centers. The closest one to us here in Forest Park is at 2000 North Recreation Park Way, NFM. Check out https://www.leegov.com/parks/centers/nfm for more information.

Membership to the center costs \$10 per individual or \$25 per family for a **lifetime membership**. Membership entitles general use of the four large Recreation Centers in Lee County including gymnasium activities and use of the "Game Room". Enrollment in programs and use of the fitness center may have an additional monthly fee. Membership cards are included with the purchase of a membership and replacement cards are \$5.

The center has a multitude of outdoor and indoor programs and amenities including a Fitness Center for a membership fee. The fitness center costs an additional \$20/month, \$80/six months or \$120/year.

If you're new to Lee County, there is so much to offer residents and visitors alike. Check out Leegov.com/parks for more information. (Events calendar, guided walks and nature programs, programs & classes, dog parks, preserves, boat ramps, sports & athletics). Get out and explore ~ your own local area.

NORTH FORT MYERS Public Library

North Fort Myers has its own Public Library located at 2001 N. Tamiami Trail.

Library Hours

Monday: 10 a.m. - 6 p.m.

Tuesday: Noon - 8 p.m.

Wednesday - Thursday: 10 a.m. - 6 p.m.

Friday - Saturday: 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.

You may obtain a new library card by visiting your local branch. You will need a Florida drivers license or Florida ID, and proof of residency here in Lee County to obtain one. There is a list of eligible documents you can present, available online. Summer is a great time to pick up a book and read while the weather heats up or for those rainy days.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to approve the initiative to have all residents place paint, pesticides, chemicals, florescent



bulbs and gas bottles at curbside. Park employees will pick up these materials on Tuesday and Friday and log them in. These articles will be stored and disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members. The rules and regulations have been changed to reflect the process.
