Gail Pare, Editor of our park Newsletter, will be stepping down from this position once her home is sold and she returns north. We wish to thank her for a job well done!


With her resignation, the editor position is open. Please notify Gail Pare at (603) 507-7572 if you are interested in volunteering for this important job.


#### **MARQUEE**





### FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS

Remember - Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.).



The wristbands are normally available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along. Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules and Regulations.

#### **TRASH**



Please note that our maintenance workers are now scheduled to work 6:00am-2:00pm rather than 7:00am-3:00pm. Given that, please have your garbage ready for pick-up by 7:00am to assure that it does not get missed.

And, once again, please assure that your garbage bags are not more than 30 pounds. If too heavy, the bags will be left. Be mindful that all of the garbage that is picked up has to be thrown into the compactor and the weight of the bags when too heavy creates a risk of injury. A previous maintenance worker was out with a severe shoulder injury caused by throwing too heavy of a bag into the compactor and he was out of work for months because of it.

#### GREEN TREE STICKER

There is a little green tree sticker available in the office that goes on the **LEFT SIDE** OF YOUR BACK WINDOW



on your car. All residents with automobiles should have this highly visible authorization to be in the park. This will help the safety patrol on their nightly rounds. If you are a temporary resident and don't want any stickers on your window, then scotch tape it there while you are here.


REMINDER Aluminum Cans are still being collected on Monday evenings only.

Lord, bless those we love on this October day, Be they near, or far away.




We bring them all to you in prayer, and ask you to keep them in your care!

#### **QUILT CLUB**

The month of pumpkins, witches and goblins has arrived. October, fall is in the air up here in Wisconsin. Harvest time in the fields and gardens. The orange pumpkins are appearing on front yards with sale

signs as it seems that the harvest is prolific. I am sure this month many of you will be heading back to Forest Park, or at least starting to think about it!

I love this time of year for quilting. The rich colors on the leaves turn orange, yellow and brown. When I pull out those fall fabrics, I have noticed that purple seems to make those colors "pop". Just look at marshes and meadows and you will see purple as an accent color to the rust and oranges of fall. I like to look to nature for inspiration! You can not go wrong with color choices of fabrics if you follow mother nature's suggestions.

Many quilters struggle with picking fabrics for a quilt. There are many schools of thought about the process. One is...just buy the kit that has all the fabrics with the correct yardages and prints and get started. Others rely on a color wheel with primary and secondary colors, contrasting colors and such. I have always thought that was way too much trouble. I like to pull out a piece of fabric I like and audition different colors and prints with it. When in doubt if a fabric is right, I think...if I put this piece in the quilt, do I like it? Or if I take it away,

is it missing! I sometimes end up with many choices that would work....but which works best? Ok that is when I leave it for a while and come back later and look again.

This works if you own enough "stash" of fabric. I confess ... .I own enough "stash" that my husband has tried to make me promise to not buy any more until I use up what I have!!! Well that isn't really what he said.... He said "promise me you will use it up before you kick the bucket!" I told him I think I am going to hang around a really long time! I also suggested that he can just call my quilting friends and tell them to just come and take whatever they want! So quilting buddies we have to help each other out here.

It comes down to just get started and let the quilt develop as you go. Years ago quilts were made from the scrap basket. Leftovers from cotton dresses and work shirts that were made for the family. Some of you will remember the feed mills having printed cotton bags sewn to hold flour, sugar and chicken feed. Thus flour sack dish towels...still the best for drying dishes. Ladies would send the husband to the mill to find 4 sacks that were the same print, because it took 4 sacks to make a dress. Each sack was about a yard of precious fabric. The scraps would then be used for quilts for warmth in the winter.

If you are fortunate enough to own one of grandma's quilts, think about the rich history of it, along with the amount of effort and love that went into it. It is a priceless history of your family. Today we have many more choices, but the love and effort that goes into each quilt is priceless. Just remember it is the process of creating that can bring joy to the creator, but the joy of giving a gift of your love and effort makes it all worthwhile.



#### **Hurricane Guidelines for Pets**

- Keep current color photos of your pets with your emergency supplies.
- If you know that a disaster (such as a hurricane) is immediate, bring your pets inside. Lee County Ordinance prohibits pets from being tethered outside.
- Because of a greater threat of disease, it is important that your animals be up-to-date on their vaccinations.
- If you must evacuate, take your pets with you. Your pet's best protection is to be with you.
- Call ahead to make sure that hotels will accept your animals. Evacuation shelters will not accept pets of any kind unless designated an "Evacuation Pet Shelter." Find pet-friendly lodging in Florida and throughout the United States at <a href="www.petswelcome.com">www.petswelcome.com</a> (Under "Instant Pet Friendly Search," select a state and city) or <a href="www.bringfido.com">www.bringfido.com</a>. You should pick a location outside of the area where the hurricane is projected to hit.
- Call boarding kennels or veterinarians with boarding facilities to see the possibility of housing them. Ask if someone will be there with the pets during the hurricane and if their boarding facility is structurally prepared to withstand hurricane-force winds.
- Ask friends or family to provide temporary foster care for your pets.
- Lee County's Evacuation Pet Shelter will be open for residents who live in areas that are under mandatory evacuation orders in the area where they live. This option should be your last resort if you are unable to execute your own personal evacuation plan for your family and pets. It should not be your "evacuation plan." Get more information about the Evacuation Pet Shelter.
- Acquire an impact resistant pet carrier or cage for each animal to use as protection if you are riding out the storm with your pets at home. Exceptions can be made to house more than one animal per carrier but do not mix different animal species together! Frightened animals may exhibit behavior changes. If you evacuate and must leave your pets behind, do not leave pets in carriers as they will not be able to get more food and water when needed. Remember, you may not be able to get back to your house for days or weeks. A carrier should permit a dog or cat to stand up and turn around in it. Help your pet to adjust to a carrier as part of routine training to reduce the stress of being confined. Place additional ID on the carrier. Birds should have a perch to grasp. (Birds, however, should be left in their cages for safety.)
- Survey your home to determine the safest location away from windows. Cover large openings of carrier or cage to protect from flying debris. Provide high areas when there is a risk of flooding.
