Their devotion to our way of life is what keeps this park not only affordable, but a safe and clean environment, that we are happy to return to year after year.

We have seen a wide variety of people volunteer for our Board of Directors to assist with keeping our park out of the hands of a management company, which would undoubtedly increase our costs. These people give their best to do what's right for the community as a whole. After all they all live here too!

Time and effort are put into our founding documents, to ensure that we keep the park not only financially strong, but strong in character. We came through last year's hurricane as a solid group, we love our homes here and our community!

One of the most important aspects of the Board of Director is to ensure the rules set out before us and voted on by our membership are adhered to. The By Laws

and Deed of Restrictions are documents that protect our investments and our quality of life here in Forest Park. The Rules and Regulations are a live document that is managed by the active board of directors again with the intention of keeping our quality of life as expected.

Each household is given these documents upon purchasing their home and are always available online at Forestparkonline.com or by hard copy in the Office. It's important that we all understand some of the basic guidelines to avoid hits to our budgets, ensure the safety of our residents, the cleanliness of the park and overall quality of life here at Forest Park. Some of the issues that come up quite often are:

- Speeding The park has many walkers and bike riders, please obey the speed limits. The speeding near the Pool, Pickle Ball and Clubhouse area has truly become a danger! Members pull in and out of the area regularly on golf carts and bicycles, they will have no protections against a speeding vehicle. Throughout the Park our Posted Speed Limit is 15 MPH
- Rolling through Stop Signs Each intersection is clearly marked; our park is no different than a regular road. The only difference is you could be hurting your neighbor or their family members. Take it easy and obey the Stop Signs.
- Unattended Guests in the Pools Guests should have a GREEN Wrist Band when using the pool, they should know your address when asked. Please be vigilant.
- Unsightly Property Be proud of your home. Be courteous to your neighbors. Be safe with unexpected storms.
- Forest Park Green Car Stickers -We are back in session and have night patrol in place to keep you and your property under a watchful eye. Cars on property without a green Forest Park Sticker on the back of the vehicle will be noted by the team and sent to the office. Stickers are available for FREE in the office. Using the identifiers helps us know if we have strangers in the park.
- Late Trash Set Outs All trash needs to be set out <u>before 7am</u> on Tuesday. Second rounds of trash pickup for late set outs are costly and really overworks our Maintenance Team if it gets too hot. Your trash can be put out the evening before if in a trash can.
- Improper Use of Dumpsters Dumpsters are CLEARLY marked. It's dangerous for the Maintenance Team to climb into the dumpster to

- retrieve improperly dumped items. Contractors working on your home are also required to take the debris with them off site.
- Late HOA Fees Please do your best to send your HOA fee in by the 1st of the month. It's also important to make your check payable for the amount of your HOA Fee rounding up or down adds additional work for our accounting team.
- Quiet Time/Lawn Mowing Our rules for In Season Quiet Time is 11PM to 8AM. Please be respectful of your neighbors.
- General Membership Meetings We are membership community. Monthly General Membership meetings are an important part of keeping our park a great place to live. Please make an effort to attend in person to help us meet our quorums for voting on issues large and small. If you can't make it in person, please join us by Zoom so your voice can be heard and so you have a full understanding of any issues. Zoom can be done on your Smart Phone, computer, or tablet, it's very user friendly and it allows you to hear firsthand the strides made and challenges ahead to keep Forest Park a great place to live. Your expertise could be exactly what we need to turn a needed project into something great!!!
- **Volunteer** We need your help, please consider volunteering for the Board, a committee or just to lend a helping hand. It's the skills that people bring that make us a great place to be!

We're looking forward to a terrific season, so glad you are all here!


I don't always have an answer, but I promise I'll always try to match you with someone who does.





### FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS



Remember - Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.). If you see something, say something, lets all be vigilant.

The wristbands are available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along. Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules and Regulations.

#### **Trash**

Please note that our maintenance workers are now scheduled to work 6:00am-2:00pm rather than 7:00am-3:00pm. Given that, please have your garbage ready for pick-up before 6:00am to assure that it does not get missed. You can put it out the night before as long as it is in a barrel.

And, once again, please ensure that your garbage bags are not more than 30 pounds. If too heavy, the bags will be left. Be mindful that all the garbage that is picked up must be thrown into the compactor and the weight of the bags when too heavy creates a risk of injury.



TRASH PICKUP – TUESDAY only (place your trash out <u>after</u> 6 p.m. the night before but before 7 a.m. the day of pickup. Trash pickup will resume two days per week

starting in January 2024. **BULK PICKUP – WEDNESDAY only** 

WASTE PRO - RECYCLE PICKUP - FRIDAY (place recycles out <u>before</u> 6 a.m. ~ They have been known to show up at 6:30 a.m.)

#### **GREEN TREE STICKER**



There is a little green tree sticker available in the office that goes on the **LEFT SIDE** OF YOUR BACK WINDOW on your car. All residents with automobiles should have this

highly visible authorization to be in the park. This will help the safety patrol on their nightly rounds. If you are a temporary resident and don't want any stickers on your window, then scotch tape it there while you are here.

#### RECYCLING BLUE BIN

#### FRIDAY is Recycle Day!!

The blue bin is used for all other types of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash that is picked up on Tuesday's. Recycling saves the park money from Waste-Pro.




