

Dear Forest Park Members.

I am writing this letter to clarify some issues. I have been on the Board for 5 years and President for the last four. During my term, I have always stressed my need for transparency. Getting members involved and helping with different tasks in the daily operations of Forest Park.

We constantly urge residents to sign in and sign out when leaving or returning to the Park when absences are for a week or longer. This is to assure that we can reach you. It makes a huge difference if we can deliver something to your house or if we have to mail it. The office tries to keep a list of people who are here and not here. We can only do that with your cooperation.

An example of what I am talking about is the Pool Vote. It takes a crew of volunteers to assemble the vote for delivery and mailing and not having accurate information about who is here and who is not, wastes time and resources. Mailings are a big expense which we try to minimize.

I realize this is not hurricane season but just a week ago we had a tornado warning. We need to know if we need to come and check on you or not. After Hurricane Ian the Fire Department was in here inquiring if everyone was accounted for. We cannot do that without your cooperation in signing in and signing out.

Be aware that Forest Park does not recognize the site Forest Park Issues & Comments and Forest Park Facebook pages and we do not respond to these sites. If at anytime you have any questions, please contact a board member or the office. You can contact any board member from 8:00am-5:00pm week days (unless it is an emergency, in which case we would expect a call).

It is very difficult to get volunteers and this Park belongs to everyone. Please help those who volunteer and make it easier for everyone to get things done.

- Unattended Guests in the Pools Guests should have a GREEN Wrist Band when using the pool, they should know your address when asked. Please be vigilant.
- Unsightly Property Be proud of your home. Be courteous to your neighbors. Be safe with unexpected storms.
- Forest Park Green Car Stickers -We are back in session and have night patrol in place to keep you and your property under a watchful eye. Cars on property without a green Forest Park Sticker on the back of the vehicle will be



noted by the team and sent to the office. Stickers are available for FREE in the office. Using the identifiers helps us know if we have strangers in the park.

- Late Trash Set Outs All trash needs to be set out before 7am on Tuesday & Friday. Second rounds of trash pickup for late set outs are costly and really overworks our Maintenance Team if it gets too hot. Your trash can be put out the evening before if in a trash can.
- Improper Use of Dumpsters Dumpsters are CLEARLY marked. It's dangerous for the Maintenance Team to climb into the dumpster to retrieve improperly dumped items. Contractors working on your home are also required to take the debris with them off site.
- Late HOA Fees Please do your best to send your HOA fee in by the 1st of the month. It's also important to make your check payable for the amount of your HOA Fee rounding up or down adds additional works for our accounting team.
- Quiet Time/Lawn Mowing Our rules for In Season Quiet Time is 11PM to 8AM. Please be respectful of your neighbors.
- General Membership Meetings We are a membership community. Monthly General Membership meetings are an important part of keeping our park a great place to live. Please make an effort to attend in person to help us meet our quorums for voting on issues large and small. If you can't make it in person, please join us by Zoom so your voice can be heard and so you have a full understanding of any issues. Zoom can be done on your Smart Phone, computer, or tablet, it's very user friendly and it allows you to hear firsthand the strides made and challenges ahead to keep Forest Park a great place to live. Your expertise could be exactly what we need to turn a needed project into something great!!!

• **Volunteer** — We need your help, please consider volunteering for the Board, a committee or just to lend a helping hand. It's the skills that people bring that make us a great place to be!

TRASH PICKUP

Please note that our maintenance workers are now scheduled to work 6:00am-2:00pm rather than 7:00am-3:00pm. Given that, please have your garbage ready for pick-up <u>before</u> 6:00am to assure that it does not get missed. You can put it out the night before as long as it is in a barrel.

And, once again, please ensure that your garbage bags are not more than 30 pounds. If too heavy, the bags will be left. Be mindful that all the garbage that is picked up

must be thrown into the compactor and the weight of the bags when too heavy creates a risk of injury.

TRASH PICKUP – TUESDAY & FRIDAY (place your trash out <u>after</u> 6 p.m. the night before but before 7 a.m. the day of pickup.

BULK PICKUP - WEDNESDAY only

WASTE PRO - <u>RECYCLE PICKUP</u> - FRIDAY (place recycles out <u>before</u> 6 a.m. ~ They have been known to show up at 6:30 a.m.)

GREEN TREE STICKER

There is a **little green tree sticker** available in the office that goes on the **LEFT SIDE** OF YOUR BACK WINDOW on your car. All residents with automobiles should have this highly visible authorization to be in the park. This will help the safety patrol on their nightly rounds. If you are a temporary resident and don't want any stickers on your window, then scotch tape it there while you are here.

RECYCLING BLUE BIN

FRIDAY is Recycle Day!!

The blue bin is used for all other types of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash that is picked up on Tuesday's. Recycling saves the park money from Waste-Pro.

ALUMINUM CAN RECYCLE

REMINDER Aluminum Cans are still being collected on **Monday evenings only**.

Please DO NOT use the can as an ashtray. Beer Drinkers, please rinse out the can and turn it over to dry out. Please remember to put your aluminum cans in

a bag and place UNDER YOUR MAILBOX by 5:00 P.M. MONDAY EVENING for pick up. They will NO LONGER be picked up on Tuesday morning. Please make sure your cans are rinsed CLEAN and DRY.

Please place it away from trash bags. DO NOT place plastic, glass or metal cans in the bag, *aluminum cans only!* All the others go in the blue recycle bins. Money collected from can recycling helps pay some of the costs of Social Club activities. It benefits all residents of Forest Park.






