

• Speeding – The park has many walkers and bike riders, please obey the speed limits. The speeding near the Pool, Pickle Ball and Clubhouse area has truly become a danger! Members pull in and out of the area regularly on golf carts and bicycles, they will have no protections against a speeding vehicle. Throughout the Park our Posted Speed Limit is 15 MPH.

EDITOR THOUGHTS



As Mother's Day is on May 12, I would like to reflect on my mother. She was born on February 12, 1925, on our family farm which was homesteaded in

1863 by her grandparents. She was part of the "Greatest Generation", as Tom Brokaw would say. The eldest of three girls. My mom walked to country school a half mile down the road. She started school at the age of four because Grandma couldn't keep track of her when the

neighbor girls walked to school. One of her first memories was taking a glass of water to bed at night and finding it frozen in the morning. Another highlight of her childhood was when Grandpa brought home a four hole outhouse, with two of the holes cut smaller so the girls didn't have to worry about falling in. Growing up during the great depression, they were never poor. Growing all their own vegetables, butchering a hog, making their own soap, raising chickens, and milking cows by hand. Play time was spent with the three neighbor girls right across the road, riding their bicycles, or playing with dolls grandma had sewn by hand. Their dresses were made out of cloth feed sacks that were recycled after they were empty.

My mother graduated high school at the age of 16 and had to wait a year before she would be admitted to college. She went for two years and received a teachers normal certificate, which allowed her to teach elementary school. After teaching for one year she married my father at the age of twenty and settled down as a farmer's wife. Eight years later I was born, followed by my brother three years later, and at the age of forty one, my little sister came along. My mother made many of our clothes, knitted, crocheted, quilted, canned, hauled grain, milked cows, fed baby calves, pitched manure, warmed baby pigs in our oven, and returned to teach school for six years before my sister was born.

My mother lived to be ninety three years old, was always busy, and very opinionated up until a week before she passed from a stroke. Remember your mother on Mothers Day, and if you still have your mother, give her a call and tell her how much you love her!!

FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS



Remember - Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.). If you see something, say something, let's all be vigilant.

The wristbands are available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along. Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules and Regulations.

TRASH PICKUP

Please note that our maintenance workers are now scheduled to work 6:00 am-2:00 pm rather than 7:00 am-3:00 pm. Trash pickup will be on TUESDAY only throughout the summer. Given that, please have your garbage ready for pick-up before 6:00 am to assure that it



does not get missed. You can put it out after 6:00 pm the night before as long as it is in a barrel.

And, once again, please ensure that your garbage bags are not

more than 30 pounds. Dumping kitty litter into a plastic grocery bag will not work. The bags break and leave the kitty litter on the street. Please use a Hefty enough bag so it doesn't break. If too heavy, the bags will be left. Be mindful that all the garbage that is picked up must be thrown into the compactor and the weight of the bags when too heavy creates a risk of injury. If you have any broken glass please DO NOT put it in a plastic garbage bag. Our workers have been punctured when picking up the bag. Put the glass in a clearly marked cardboard box and set it out.

BULK PICKUP – WEDNESDAY ONLY

For large furniture items or appliances, please call the office on Tuesday between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm so the maintenance workers can plan on picking it up.



RECYCLING BLUE BIN

WASTE PRO - FRIDAY is Recycle Day!!

The blue bin is used for all other types of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic,

CARDBOARD, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash that is picked up on Tuesday's. Recycling saves the park money from Waste-Pro.


