

FROM THE PRESIDENT Ken Parsels

It is time for a pool refurbishment update. This month's letter is from the Pool Committee BOD liaison, Barry Simes.

Our pool has been functioning very well and has improved since the filters were changed. Please help us keep it that way by showering prior to entering the pool to remove sunscreen and lotion which is detrimental to the filters.

Our pool is checked every day for proper operation and water quality to comply with Department of

Health requirements. The pool and associated systems are maintained by a professional Certified Pool

Technician. Our goal is to maintain the pool to the highest standards and keep all systems functioning at peak performance. However, if you have any recommendations or questions on the pool operation, please notify the office as your input is greatly appreciated to support this mission.

The Pool Committee has been busy lately getting the refurbishment project kicked off. We have chosen our pool contractor from three reputable companies that quoted.

Price negotiations have been successfully completed and costs are well within our budget at this point. Final contract review is expected to wrap up in time to kick the project off in June.

Pool Refurbishment Project Scope

- Refurbish coping, pool surface and tiles, drains, pool light and deck area with pavers.
- Pressure test all pool plumbing.
- Stabilize concrete deck area with polyurethane foam injection
- Upgrade chemical control system New Cat 2000
- Replace one pool heater New Built Right heater
- Six new table umbrellas
- New pool rules signage
- Repair Com Pac filtration cover
- Remove, modify and reinstall fence to support all work

In the meantime, we have been picking out color and style themes for the deck, pool interior and tiles on the coping around the perimeter of the pool. We are also working on an information board in the clubhouse where samples of the chosen materials will be on display along with details of the project plan.

Once the materials are ordered and we collaborate with the contactors, a detailed plan will be generated and followed up with periodic updates. The pool will need to be shut down for a period of time and we are working to plan this so it is the shortest time possible. The project is expected to be complete by the end of 2024.

RESIDENTS NEED TO REMEMBER:

• Speeding – The park has many walkers and bike riders, please obey the speed limits. The speeding near the Pool, Pickle Ball and Clubhouse area has truly become a danger! Members pull in and out of the area regularly on golf carts and bicycles, they will have no protections against a speeding vehicle. Throughout the Park our Posted Speed Limit is 15 MPH.





• Rolling through Stop Signs – Each intersection is clearly marked; our park is no different than a regular road. The only difference is you could be hurting your neighbor or their family members. Take it easy and obey the Stop Signs.

- Unattended Guests in the Pools Guests should have a GREEN WRISTBAND when using the pool, they should know your address when asked. Please be vigilant.
- Unsightly Property Be proud of your home. Be courteous to your neighbors. Be safe with unexpected storms.
- Forest Park Green Car Stickers -We are still in session and have night patrol in place to keep you and your property under a watchful eye. Cars on property without a green Forest Park Sticker on the back of the vehicle will be noted by the team and sent to the office. Stickers are available for FREE in the office. Using the identifiers helps us know if we have strangers in the park.
- Late Trash Set Outs All trash needs to be set out <u>before 7am</u> on Tuesday. Second rounds of trash pickup for late set outs are costly and really



pickup for late set outs are costly and really overworks our Maintenance Team if it gets too hot. Your trash can be put out the evening before if in a trash can.

• Improper Use of Dumpsters – Dumpsters are CLEARLY marked. It's dangerous for the Maintenance Team to climb into the dumpster to retrieve improperly dumped items. *Contractors working on your home are also required to take the debris with them off site.*

- Late HOA Fees Please do your best to send your HOA fee in by the 1st of the month. It's also important to make your check payable for the exact amount of your HOA Fee rounding up or down adds additional work for our accounting team.
- Quiet Time/Lawn Mowing Our rules for In Season Quiet Time is 11PM to 8AM. Please be respectful of your neighbors.

EDITOR THOUGHTS



As Father's Day is on June 16, I would like to reflect on my father. He was born on September 29, 1924, on the Johnson family farm North of Wadena, Iowa, which was homesteaded by his grandparents in the 1800's. He was part of the "Greatest Generation", as Tom

Brokaw would say. The middle child of three, and the only boy. My dad walked to country school a mile through the timber along Mink Creek in NorthEast Iowa. He started school at the age of four because Grandma thought that his 5 year old sister shouldn't walk to school alone. Dad lived with two sets of parents. My grandpa and his brother farmed the homestead together. My dad always said he couldn't get in trouble with his Uncle and Aunt living in the same house. They farmed with mules back then. Dad was raking hay with a "dump rake" and a team of mules when he was 10. A single tree broke, swung around and hit the mule in the hind legs. This spooked the mules and they took off running while my father tried to hang on for dear life. He fell off and was caught in the tines of the dump rake, rolling along with the hay. He was not injured, but the windrow was quite large. Another time he had his index finger get caught in the hand crank corn sheller which mutilated his finger nail and the end of his finger.

My father graduated high school at the age of 16 in 1941 and two years later was drafted into the military. They discovered he had a punctured eardrum and was deferred. He continued farming with his uncle



and my grandpa until he was twenty and then married my mother. He then moved in with her parents and began farming with his in-laws. Sharing another house, my parents lived upstairs in our 6 bedroom, no bath house, with a dumb waiter to bring food up from the cellar. Eight years later I was born, followed by my brother three years later, and at the age of forty one, my little sister came along. I remember getting an indoor toilet. My father taught me the meaning of hard work, how to hunt, and my love for the Chicago Cubs comes from going to Wrigley Field for a Sunday double header in 1961 and several years thereafter. Dad farmed his whole life, milking cows by hand before getting a milking machine. He had a "slipped disk" in his back, but still stacked hay bales, pitched manure, and scooped grain.

My father passed away at the age of 64 after a six

month battle with intestinal cancer. He never retired and was combining corn the night before he was to go into the hospital to have the cancer removed. Hardly a day goes by that I don't wish I could have one more visit!! If you still have your father, give them a call or visit this Fathers Day!!





FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS

Remember - Visitors unaccompanied by Forest

Park residents must wear wristbands when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.). If you see something, say something, let's all be vigilant.



The wristbands are available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along. Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules and Regulations.

TRASH PICKUP

Please note that our maintenance workers are now scheduled to work 6:00 am-2:00 pm rather than 7:00 am-3:00 pm. Trash pickup will be on



TUESDAY only throughout the summer. Given that, please have your garbage ready for pick-up **before 6:00 am** to assure that it does not get missed. You can put it out after 6:00 pm the night before as long as it is in a barrel.



And, once again, please ensure that your garbage bags are not more than 30 pounds. Dumping kitty litter into a plastic grocery bag will not work. The bags break and leave the

kitty litter on the street. Please use a <u>Hefty</u> enough bag so it doesn't break. If too heavy, the bags will be left. Be mindful that all the garbage that is picked up must be thrown into the compactor and the weight of the bags when too heavy creates a risk of injury. If you have any broken glass please **DO NOT** put it in a plastic garbage bag. Our workers have been punctured when picking up the bag. Put the glass in a clearly marked cardboard box and set it out.

BULK PICKUP – WEDNESDAY only

For large furniture items or appliances, please call the office on Tuesday between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm so the maintenance workers can plan on picking it up.

RECYCLING BLUE BIN WASTE PRO - FRIDAY is Recycle Day!!

The blue bin is used for all other types of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, CARDBOARD, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash that is



picked up on Tuesday's. Recycling saves the park money from Waste-Pro.


