

FROM THE PRESIDENT

I hope everyone has had a great summer so far this year. Everyone is able to enjoy their time, either here at Forest Park, or your home away from here. This letter is a reminder of what Forest Park was, when it initially started back in the 70's. It has always been a great place to retire to enjoy your golden years. Everyone knew what was expected of them, and were glad to **volunteer**, or do it for the benefit of making Forest Park the best park in Southwest Florida.

We have the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, Rules and Regulations to go by. In order for the Park to keep its beauty and reputation, we need to continue doing what is expected now, as well as what was expected then.

On September 28, 2022 we had the biggest hurricane to ever hit our area. The Board voted to give our residents some extra time to get their property back in order. It is now that time that we get back to where we should be. House repairs should be completed by now. Portable sheds (plastic and canvas) should be gone. They have never before, or are not now allowed in the Park. According to the Rules and Regs., that have been in effect for years, this is a violation that will be enforced. Your houses need to be in good repair, washed or painted as needed. Carports, Florida rooms, and front porches should be repaired or replaced if they are damaged. Carports and lawns are not storage areas. They need to have items removed that do

not belong there. Remember, high winds can blow items around. I'm sure you wouldn't be happy if a neighbor's stuff blew into your house causing damage. Likewise, they do not want your stuff damaging their property.

Read your manual you received when you purchased or go online to verify if you are in compliance. If you are scheduled to have repairs completed, please notify the office with a copy of your scheduled appointment so we know you are working on it.

When you purchased in the Park, you made the choice because of your first impressions of Forest Park. When selling or renting your property, remember how nice it was when you arrived? Let's try to leave it to the next generation just as nice, or better, than how we received it.

On a more positive note for everyone, we have now replaced almost all of the storm drains. We have a brand new trash compactor, a new roof on the Activities Building, and in October we will have a completely refurbished swimming pool. The Board is making progress on updating all our infrastructure. We appreciate everyone's volunteering, understanding, help, and support.

RESIDENTS NEED TO REMEMBER:

- Speeding The park has many walkers and bike riders, please obey the speed limits. The speeding near the Pool, Pickle Ball and Clubhouse area has truly become a danger! Members pull in and out of the area regularly on golf carts and bicycles, they will have no protections against a speeding vehicle. Throughout the Park our Posted Speed Limit is 15 MPH.
- Rolling through Stop Signs Each intersection is clearly marked; our park is no different than a regular road. The only difference is you could be hurting your neighbor or their family members. Take it easy and obey the Stop Signs.



- Unattended Guests in the Pools Guests should have a GREEN WRISTBAND when using the pool, they should know your address when asked. Please be vigilant.
- Unsightly Property Be proud of your home. Be courteous to your neighbors. Be safe with unexpected storms.

• Forest Park Green Car Stickers -•

Even though we are out of season, we still have night patrol in place to keep you and your property under a watchful eye. Cars on property without a green Forest Park Sticker on the back of the vehicle will be noted by



the team and sent to the office. Stickers are available for FREE in the office. <u>Using the identifiers helps us know if we have strangers in the park. This is to protect all of us.</u> Visitors are required to have a sticker. If you don't want it stuck on your back window, tape it up on the inside. I see many vehicles without these stickers.

Late Trash Set Outs – All trash needs to be set out <u>before</u> <u>7am</u> on Tuesday. Second rounds of trash pickup for late set outs are costly and really overworks our Maintenance Team if it gets too hot. Your trash can be put out the evening before if in a trash can.

- Late HOA Fees Please do your best to send your HOA fee in by the 1st of the month. It's also important to make your check payable for the *exact amount* of your HOA Fee rounding up or down adds additional work for our accounting team.
- Quiet Time/Lawn Mowing Our rules for In Summer Quiet Time are 11PM to 7AM.

Please be respectful of your neighbors!

Improper Use of Dumpsters -

Dumpsters are **CLEARLY** marked. It's dangerous for the Maintenance Team to climb into the dumpster to retrieve improperly dumped items.

Contractors working on your home are also required to take the debris with them off site.

I am happy to announce that the new Aces Compactor arrived at the end of June and was installed for less than \$34K. This new compactor was manufactured in Wisconsin with U.S. steel. It is 34 cu. yd.'s, same as the 1998 Marathon that it replaces. A new Marathon compactor is over \$52k and uses Chinese steel.



The following rules still apply, <u>only household trash</u> is allowed in the compactor, all cardboard should be set out on Friday for recycle, no horticulture, construction materials, or bulk items. The dumpsters are clearly marked. If the gate is locked, PLEASE lock the gate when you leave, to keep unauthorized people out of the R/V Park!! If you notice a vehicle in the R/V area, with out a green tree sticker, PLEASE notify the office or if after hours call a board member or the sheriffs office. These people are trespassing, leaving unauthorized refuse, and costing everyone in the park more money!!!



Notice the RED BUTTON on the controller. This is for emergencies only. DONOT TOUCH THE RED BUTTON!!

Pool Refurbishment Project – August Update HAZARDOUS WASTE By: Barry Siems

The Pool Project is Officially Kicked Off!!

The pool committee met with the pool contractor (Into H20 Pools) to firm up the schedule and details of the project. We have agreed on a project plan that we both can commit to. This plan is posted in the club house and on our website and will be updated periodically.

The deck stabilization work was completed on June

25, 2024. This was done to fill any voids under the existing concrete deck to prevent future settling and provide a solid foundation for the pavers over the life of the pool. The entire deck will be covered with pavers for a more modern look as a part of the refurbishment. Paver samples and a picture of a finished pool deck as an example is in the club house.

The pool is scheduled to shut down from July 23 through October 13, 2024. During this time, demo work will be completed, pool will be emptied, deck will be refurbished, coping refurbished, new pool finish, new pool heater and new chemical control system installed.

While the deck is being refurbished, the fence will be taken down and a temporary fence installed. After the deck is completed, the existing fence will be reinstalled on the new deck surface.

During the project, the pool area will be restricted access and closed to the residents of the park for your safety. Materials will be stored on the west side of the pool in the parking lot during this time.

The pool is scheduled to open up on October 14, 2024 with a Grand Opening Celebration. This date could change if we experience any unexpected delays. Otherwise, we will be taking advantage of expediting the project through each phase to finish early.

I hope everyone is enjoying your summer. The neighborhood watch team is out and about each evening, keeping a watchful eye on our park.








EDITOR THOUGHTS



FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS



Remember - Visitors

unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.). If you see something, say something, let's all be vigilant.

The wristbands are available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along. Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules and Regulations.

TRASH PICKUP

Please note that our maintenance workers are now scheduled to work 6:00 am-2:00 pm rather than 7:00 am-3:00 pm. Trash pickup will be on <u>TUESDAY</u> only throughout the summer. Given that, please have your garbage ready for pick-up <u>before 6:00 am</u> to assure that it does not get missed. You can put it out after 6:00 pm the night before as long as it is in a barrel.

And, once again, please ensure that your garbage bags are not more than 30 pounds. Dumping kitty litter into a plastic grocery bag will not work. The bags break and leave the kitty litter on the street. Please use a <u>Hefty</u> enough bag so it doesn't break. If too heavy, the bags will be left. Be mindful that all the garbage that is picked up must be thrown into the compactor and the weight of the bags when too heavy creates a risk of injury. If you have any broken glass please **DO NOT** put it in a plastic garbage bag. Our workers have been punctured when picking up the bag. Put the glass in a **clearly marked cardboard box** and set it out.

BULK PICKUP - WEDNESDAY only

For large furniture items or appliances, please call the office on Tuesday between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm so the maintenance workers can plan on picking it up.

RECYCLING BLUE BIN WASTE PRO - FRIDAY is Recycle Day!!

The blue bin is used for all other types of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, **CARDBOARD**, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash that is picked up on **Tuesday's**. Recycling saves the park money from Waste-Pro.




