#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

What a last couple of months this has been for Joyce and myself in New York. Joyce had an accident on the morning of Saturday, July 20 by rolling out of bed. She struck the left side of her head on the nightstand. We went to the local hospital ER and were transferred to Elmira after a CAT scan showed bleeding between Joyce' skull and brain. She started getting a severe headache after noon and having seizures. This required emergency surgery to relieve the pressure Saturday night. They had to remove a portion of her skull to remove a blood clot and relieve pressure. She did well on the 21st, having ice cream for breakfast and resting all day. Monday morning she had a sneezing spell, took a turn for the worse with seizures and a raging headache. An MRI revealed an internal bleed in her brain, after which she required a transfer to Rochester for E.E.G. monitoring. Things were touch and go for a while, but "Joyce is a fighter," her words. After several days in the ICU Joyce was transferred to the neurology

floor for monitoring. She made such a miraculous recovery that after a couple days she was transferred to the rehabilitation unit. Again, Joyce excelled by working hard to regain her strength. She was released from the hospital in Rochester and flew back here to Forest Park on Tuesday, August 13.

We can't thank everyone enough for the thoughts, prayers, and cards while we were in New York, or our Forest Park friends for getting our house opened back up for Joyce' return. The outpouring of support through your thoughts, prayers, food, and assistance is truly overwhelming. From the bottom of our heart, **THANK YOU!!**

Using the identifiers helps us know if we have strangers in the park. This is to protect all of us. Visitors are required to have a sticker. Late Trash Set Outs – All trash needs to be set out <u>before</u> <u>7am</u> on Tuesday. Second rounds of trash pickup for late set outs are costly and really overworks our Maintenance Team if it gets too hot. Your trash can be put out the evening before if in a trash can.

- Late HOA Fees Please do your best to send your HOA fee in by the 1st of the month. It's also important to make your check payable for the *exact amount* of your HOA Fee rounding up or down adds additional work for our accounting team.
- Quiet Time/Lawn Mowing Our rules for In Summer Quiet Time are 11PM to 7AM.

Please be respectful of your neighbors!

#### **Improper Use of Dumpsters**

Dumpsters are **CLEARLY** marked. It's dangerous for the Maintenance Team to climb into the dumpster to retrieve improperly dumped items.

Contractors working on your home are also required to take the debris with them off site.

The following rules still apply, only household trash is allowed in the compactor, all cardboard should be set out on Friday for recycle, no horticulture, construction materials, or bulk items. The dumpsters are clearly marked. If the gate is locked, PLEASE lock the gate when you leave, to keep unauthorized people out of the R/V Park!! If you notice a vehicle in the R/V area, with out a green tree sticker, PLEASE notify the office or if after hours call a board member or the sheriffs office. These people are trespassing, leaving unauthorized refuse, and costing everyone in the park more money!!!

Notice the RED BUTTON on the controller. This is for emergencies only. DONOT TOUCH THE RED BUTTON!!



### Pool Refurbishment Project – September Update

The pool is starting to look better already! The pool refurbishment project is progressing nicely. It was discovered the raised beam around the perimeter of



the pool required more repair than expected. All four corners had to be rebuilt before applying the new tile. This repair was completed without impacting timing or the overall budget and the tile along with top cap is now installed. Also, some minor crack repair in the pool wall was completed during this time.



The fence has been removed to facilitate the paver work on the deck area. A temporary fence was installed during this time and residents are not allowed to access the area for your safety.


Demo work in certain areas of the deck is underway to build the zero grade transition points with the pavers along with the paver installation.

The inside finish of the pool will be one of the last steps. In the meantime, a new pool heater and chemical controller will be installed along with reinstalling the fence. Once the deck is completed with the pavers,



the fence will be installed on top of the new paver deck.

The pool is scheduled to open up on October 14, 2024

### NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH/NIGHT PATROL

Please consider VOLUNTEERING for Neighborhood Watch/Night Patrol. It's only one night a month. If you are new to the park, or an 'old timer', feel free to pick up information and a volunteer form at the office, keeping a watchful eye on our park residents and residences.

Neighborhood Watch/ Night Patrol Volunteer Information Form

Thank you for volunteering to be a part of our Neighborhood Watch Team. I am very thankful for all of the volunteers here in Forest Park that help keep us safe and a watchful eye on things. As a volunteer you will patrol streets and check areas around buildings and pool.

Our presence makes a difference. Patrol times can be at your discretion: anytime after 11:00 p.m. to early morning hours. Some residents are night owls and patrol at all hours Most evenings there are just rabbits and frogs hopping around. Sometimes a coyote, and sometimes a "visitor" is in the park that doesn't belong. You then call the police and report this.

A backpack is provided with a new flashing light for golf cart/car, magnetic signs, new flashlights, and information you might need. This is picked up and returned by noon each day to the office. Notify the office of any unlocked doors, street lights out, suspicious activities, and any problems that occur. So, if you can volunteer one evening a month, this is greatly appreciated. Just fill out the form and return to the office.

Neighborhood Watch Volunteers Hello! Thank you for volunteering for neighborhood Watch Patrol. Our residents greatly appreciate you and the time given to keep us safe.



Info you will need: Sheriff # 239-477-1000

- Patrol Hours Suggested patrol hours 11:00 pm-1:00 am. But....to deter anyone, you may vary your hours. If you are a night owl, feel free to take a ride at any time during your assigned evening. You get to drive up and down each street, check the clubhouse and activity/ office doors, and surrounding outdoor areas.
- Sit at the entrance for about 15 or so minutes. Your presence makes a lot of difference to those driving, walking, and riding bikes on Hart Road. Our presence with that flashing light makes all of us feel safer.
- CHECK Doors at clubhouse, activity building, and pool restrooms. They automatically lock around 11:00 pm.
- BE SURE YOU PICK UP THE BACKPACK IN THE ACTIVITY BUILDING AND RETURN IT BY NOON THE NEXT DAY. INSIDE YOU WILL FIND A FLASHING LIGHT , NOTEBOOK, FLASHLIGHT, AND MAGNETIC SIGNS FOR YOU VEHICLE, PLUS SOME INFO AND PARK DIRECTORY
- If you find doors unlocked, lights on, try to turn them off and lock doors. Sometimes the restroom doors are not locked. Go inside and lock the interior door. NOTIFY THE OFFICE THE NEXT MORNING OF ANY ISSUES.
- If any of the street lights are out, get the number on the pole, street, and closest house number and report this to the office.
- NEVER CONFRONT ANY INTRUDER OR TRESPASSER... CALL THE SHERIFF




I have been busy checking items in the Storage Area to make sure they are licensed, tagged, and in movable condition. You will also notice new signage at your reserved spot.

#### **EDITOR THOUGHTS**

The fall season is upon us. September has arrived. Last month I discussed the ongoing need for **volunteers**. We need **volunteers** to fill positions of leadership for the Social Club, Craft Club, NorthEastern States club, Park committees and the Board of Directors.

In October the budget will be presented to all association members for your perusal and approval in November. Did you know that our Reserves Account is less than 50% funded? That means that as repairs and replacements of our infrastructure and amenities come continued on page 12

due, we may not have the necessary funds in the bank to pay for these repairs or replacements.

Our streets have not had any overlay since 2004. You may think the streets are in decent shape. But did you realize that our streets are an integral part of our storm water drainage system? All of our streets have cracks and delamination spots, but more importantly, the streets promote the proper flow of stormwater to our newly installed drainage pipes. The streets have been overlaid four times with one inch of asphalt each time. That means that all our streets are now 1" to 3" higher than most of the driveways in our park. Also, many of the cul-de-sacs are now higher than the driveways and flattened out. This is causing the water to back up into your **driveways** and carports/lanais. The most recent estimate to repair/ rebuild our streets, by milling down an average of three inches and replacing with 2" - 2 ½" of new asphalt was \$830,000.00. Our current reserve account has less than \$800,000.00, so obviously this can't be done all at once.

The banks of Hollyberry Pond and Peace Lake will need to have the unfinished banks reinforced with RipRap soon. Some areas have eroded to the point that there is not enough space to safely walk between the home and the bank. This will require a permit from Lee County to have this completed over a period of years, at an expense of tens of thousands of dollars.

Our 2004 Ford truck, 2007 John Deere Tractor/backhoe, and 2012 John Deere Gator are all reaching the end of their useful life. These items will all require tens of thousands of dollars to replace or overhaul.

The Parks Board of Directors and various Budget, Finance, Facilities Planning, and other committees will all have openings for positions to be filled in our November Elections and January committee appointments. We need **volunteers** now, more than ever, to step up and bring your knowledge and expertise to fill these positions of leadership for the Board of Directors, Committees, and other Clubs and organizations in Forest Park.

The Park needs **volunteers** to continue to be a self managed HOA. If we do not have enough **volunteers**, the alternative is to hire a **Certified Association Manager** to take over the day to day management of the Park, which will still require a board of directors. A **CAM's Manager** will cost over \$60,000 annually, money which the Park does not have.

For those of you that are interested, or need information about the opportunities to serve in Forest Park, please contact a current board member, or the office. All phone numbers are listed in the front of the Forest Park Phone directory. Let's all pitch in by working together to keep our park running smooth, and make necessary improvements. The Forest Park Community has a strong history of community involvement and volunteerism. With teamwork we can accomplish great things!



#### FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS

Remember - Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.). If you see something, say something, let's all be vigilant. The wristbands are available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along. Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules and Regulations.

#### TRASH PICKUP



Please note that our maintenance workers are now scheduled to work 6:00 am-2:00 pm rather than 7:00 am-3:00 pm. Trash pickup will be on <u>TUESDAY only throughout the summer</u>. Given that, please have your garbage ready for pick-up <u>before 6:00 am</u> to assure that it does not get missed. You can put it out after 6:00 pm the night before as long as it is in a barrel.

And, once again, please ensure that your garbage bags are not more than 30 pounds. Dumping kitty litter into a plastic grocery bag will not work. The bags break and leave the kitty litter on the street. Please use a <u>Hefty</u> enough bag so it doesn't break. If too heavy, the bags will be left. Be mindful that all the garbage that is picked up must be thrown into the compactor and the weight of the bags when too heavy creates a risk of injury. If you have any broken glass please DO NOT put it in a plastic garbage bag. Our workers have been punctured when picking up the bag. Put the glass in a clearly marked cardboard box and set it out.

#### **BULK PICKUP - WEDNESDAY only**

For large furniture items or appliances, please call the office on Tuesday between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm so the maintenance workers can plan on picking it up.

### RECYCLING BLUE BIN WASTE PRO - FRIDAY is Recycle Day!!

The blue bin is used for all other types of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, **CARDBOARD**, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash that is picked up on **Tuesday's**. Recycling saves the park money from Waste-Pro.


### ALUMINUM CAN RECYCLE - Monday By the Social Club
