RESIDENTS NEED TO REMEMBER:

- Speeding The park has many walkers and bike riders, please obey the speed limits. The speeding near the Pool, Pickle Ball and Clubhouse area has truly become a danger! Members pull in and out of the area regularly on golf carts and bicycles, they will have no protection against a speeding vehicle. Throughout the Park our Posted Speed Limit is 15 MPH.
- Rolling through Stop Signs Each intersection
 is clearly marked; our park is no different than a
 regular road. The only difference is you could be
 hurting your neighbor or their family. Take it easy
 and obey the Stop Signs.
- Unattended Guests in the Pool Guests should have a GREEN WRISTBAND when using the pool. When asked, they should know the address of the member they're visiting. Please be vigilant.
- Unsightly Property Be proud of your home. Keep your siding free of mold and mildew by power washing. Keep your lawn mowed and hedges trimmed. Be courteous to your neighbors. Be safe with unexpected storms.
- Forest Park Green Car Stickers We are back in season, we have night patrol in place to keep you and your property under a watchful eye. Cars on property without a green Forest Park Sticker on the back of the vehicle will be noted by the team and sent to the office. Stickers are available for FREE in the office. Using

- the identifiers helps us know if we have strangers in the park. This is to protect all of us. Visitors are required to have a sticker. If you don't want it stuck on your back window, tape it up on the inside. I see many vehicles without these stickers.
- Late Trash Set Outs All trash needs to be set out <u>before 7am</u> on Tuesday. Second rounds of trash pickup for late set outs are costly and really overworks our Maintenance Team if it gets too hot. Your trash can be put out the evening before if in a secured trash can.
- Late HOA Fees Please do your best to send your HOA fee in by the 1st of the month. It's also important to make your check payable for the *exact amount* of your HOA Fee rounding up or down adds additional work for our accounting team.
- Quiet Time/Lawn Mowing Our rules for In Season Quiet Time are 10PM to 8AM. Please be respectful of your neighbors!
- Improper Use of Dumpsters Dumpsters are CLEARLY marked. It's dangerous for the Maintenance Team to climb into the dumpster to retrieve improperly dumped items. Contractors working on your home are also required to take the debris with them off site.

ATTENTION

The following rules still apply, only household trash is allowed in the compactor, all cardboard should be set out on Friday for recycle, no horticulture, construction materials, or bulk items. Bulk items include any furniture, cushions, bulky pillows or life jackets. Any Aluminum may be placed near the work bench in front of the horticulture dumpster for recycling, (this includes aluminum framed lawn chairs, pop-up tent frames, carport roofs, or gutters that are aluminum. Appliances go in the metal trailer parked southwest of the compactor. If it is not regular household trash, horticulture, appliances, aluminum, or construction materials, it is a BULK ITEM. The dumpsters are clearly marked. If the gate is locked, PLEASE lock the gate when you leave, to keep unauthorized people out of the R/V Park!! If you notice a vehicle in the R/V area, with out a green tree sticker, PLEASE notify the office or if after hours call a board member or the sheriffs office. These people are trespassing, leaving unauthorized refuse, and costing everyone in the park more money!!!

Notice the RED BUTTON on the controller. This is for emergencies only. DO NOT TOUCH THE RED BUTTON!!

might not create a problem 6 or 8 might. (Think of it as one dessert pie short.)



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!!! ATTENTION: RETURNING SNOWBIRDS AND NEW RESIDENTS.



Please consider VOLUNTEERING for Neighborhood Watch/Night Patrol. It's only one night per month. If you are new to the park, or an 'old timer', feel free to pick up information and a volunteer form at the office, keeping a watchful eye on our park residents and residences. It is vitally

important to the safety and security of everyone in our Park. In the past we have had bicycles, golf carts, and tools stolen, as well as squatters moving into vacant homes. We have also had drug activity. Noone wants that in our Park.

Info you will need: Sheriff # 239-477-1000

- Patrol Hours Suggested patrol hours 11:00 pm-1:00 am. But....to deter anyone, you may vary your hours. If you are a night owl , feel free to take a ride at any time during your assigned evening. You get to drive up and down each street, check the clubhouse and activity/ office doors, and surrounding outdoor areas.
- Sit at the entrance for about 15 or so minutes. Your presence makes a lot of difference to those driving, walking, and riding bikes on Hart Road. Our presence with that flashing light makes all of us feel safer.
- CHECK Doors at clubhouse, activity building, and pool restrooms. They automatically lock around 11:00 pm.
- BE SURE YOU PICK UP THE BACKPACK IN THE ACTIVITY BUILDING AND RETURN IT BY NOON THE NEXT DAY. INSIDE YOU WILL FIND A FLASHING LIGHT , NOTEBOOK, FLASHLIGHT, AND MAGNETIC SIGNS FOR YOUR VEHICLE, PLUS SOME INFO AND PARK DIRECTORY
- If you find doors unlocked, lights on, try to turn them
 off and lock doors. Sometimes the restroom doors
 are not locked. Go inside and lock the interior door.
 NOTIFY THE OFFICE THE NEXT MORNING
 OF ANY ISSUES.
- If any of the street lights are out, get the number on the pole, street, and closest house number and report this to the office.
- NEVER CONFRONT ANY INTRUDER

OR TRESPASSER... CALL THE SHERIFF IMMEDIATELY 🕏

Signing in and Out

The office asks that all residents sign in & out of the Park using either the Arrival & Departure Log in the Activities Building or by notifying the office directly.

If the office knows you are away & we have your northern address voting ballots can be mailed directly to you.

Although it cannot be guaranteed to 'keep an eye' on all properties, it is valuable to the Park knowing which properties are occupied.

Our night patrol does check in with the office if they see unusual activity & we can share this information with the owner.

If you are not receiving these email blasts please first check your spam folders, and if they are not in that folder, contact the office and they will endeavor to resolve the problem.

RV STORAGE PARK

John Hill oversees the R/V Park storage area, keeps the spots properly assigned, maintains the signage, inspects the trailers/campers and motorhomes for road worthiness,



and for up to date tags. Remember to keep your info up to date and your item tagged, insured, and in working order. If you have not moved your RV, trailer, boat, etc. in the last 9 months, you are depriving someone else of a spot in our park. Our rules state that if you have not used your spot for 9 months, your spot may be reassigned to someone else. If you have not moved it in 9 months, it may be considered not using your spot. You are abusing the privilege of a FREE spot (for now). Other residents are waiting for a spot. If you no longer need your spot, please let the office know. If you need a spot to store your RV, trailer, boat, etc let the office know so you can be put on the list. IF YOU HAVE A BOAT, CAMPER, OR TRAILER IN YOUR DRIVEWAY OR YARD FOR OVER 24 HOURS; THIS IS A VIOLATION OF THE RULES & REGULATIONS THAT YOU AGREED TO WHEN PURCHASING IN FOREST PARK! PLEASE INQUIRE OF A SPACE IN OUR R/V PARK OR FIND A COMMERCIAL STORAGE AREA TO RENT.

In 2008, there were more than 22 active clubs in Forest Park. There were state clubs as well as CERTS, art, chorus, billiards, ladies' and mens' golf, the Book Club, several dance clubs, and an embroidery club just to mention a few. Koffee Klatches with guest speakers met monthly. A Welcome Back dinner kicked off the season, with a holiday dinner in December, and a New Year's celebration. The 50th Anniversary dinner was held in February which was an elegant affair.

In 2015, about 18 clubs remained. Only the Northeast Club continued to host monthly meetings. The Book Club, Chorus, Craft, and Quilt Club were a few of the surviving groups and a computer club and pickleball club were added. Bingo, exercise classes, and card games were active. The Park dinner's had disappeared with only the Anniversary Party remaining.

The Social Club met in late November. At the meeting, Ellen Heigham, who has been working extremely hard to keep things going, talked about upcoming events. She explained that no-one was being asked to run for an office or take a leadership role. All she was asking for was people to help with small tasks such as setting up tables for an event, collecting tickets, or helping clean up. The handful of people at the meeting signed up for some of the slots but more remain empty.

Well, have we got a deal for you! Being a **volunteer** doesn't always mean a full time position. Sometimes it's





FOREST PARK VISITORS WRISTBANDS

Remember - Visitors unaccompanied by Forest Park residents must wear wristbands



when using park recreational facilities (pool, mini-golf, etc.). If you see something, say something, let's all be vigilant. The wristbands are available in the park office (2 per family and additional bands may be requested). The bands stretch but if they are not large enough you may pin them to clothing, attach them to a key chain or just bring them along. Please remember that all owners are responsible for their visitors who must comply with all Forest Park Rules and Regulations.

TRASH PICKUP

Please note that our maintenance workers are now scheduled to work **6:00 am - 2:00 pm** rather than 7:00 am-3:00 pm. Trash pickup will



be on <u>TUESDAY only through December</u>. Given that, please have your garbage ready for pick-up <u>before 6:00</u> <u>am</u> to assure that it does not get missed. You can put it out after 6:00 pm the night before as long as it is in a barrel.



And, once again, please ensure that your garbage bags are not more than 30 pounds. Dumping kitty litter into a plastic grocery bag will not work. The bags break and leave the

kitty litter on the street. Please use a <u>Hefty</u> enough bag so it doesn't break. If too heavy, the bags will be left. Be mindful that all the garbage that is picked up must be thrown into the compactor and the weight of the bags when too heavy creates a risk of injury. If you have any broken glass please **DO NOT** put it in a plastic garbage bag. Our workers have been punctured when picking up the bag. Put the glass in a **clearly marked cardboard** box and set it out.

BULK PICKUP – WEDNESDAY only

For large furniture items or appliances, please call the office on Tuesday between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm so the maintenance workers can plan on picking it up.

RECYCLING BLUE BIN WASTE PRO - FRIDAY is Recycle Day!!

The blue bin is used for all other types of recycling such as paper, metal, plastic, **CARDBOARD**, etc. This is a separate program from our regular trash that is picked up on **Tuesday's**. Recycling saves the park money from Waste-Pro.

ALUMINUM CAN RECYCLE - Monday




