

FESTIVAL OF TREES

If you have never been to the Fort Myers Festival of Trees, you should put it on your holiday to-do list. Held annually at the Sidney Berne Davis Art



Center located at 2301 First Street in downtown Fort Myers, the four day Festival is a fundraiser for the Center and benefits several charities.

The Festival of Trees features trees decorated and donated by local groups, businesses and patrons. Each elaborate tree has a theme, and many "gifts" on and around the tree. Visitors pay an entrance fee of \$2 to enter and vote for the tree they like best. In addition, raffle tickets are sold for a chance to win one of the trees. Raffle tickets are placed in a bucket located near each tree. Winners are drawn for each tree on the last day of the Festival. The trees and all that go with them are then delivered to winners and set up free of charge.

Make no mistake...these are not your average Christmas trees! They are often more elaborate than those seen in department stores or other businesses. Some examples of the themes for the trees are wine or other adult beverages, tools (complete with power tools and tool boxes under the tree), Barbie, patriotic, Florida, backyard barbeque (grill and cooler included), music, baking, sports, and fitness. Donors not only try to make their trees more attractive and desirable than prior years, but also try to outdo each other. The result is an awe-inspiring treat for visitors and a very Merry Christmas for the winners. The value of each tree is posted on a sign

near the tree. Values of the entire package are hundreds or thousands of dollars. Raffle tickets range from \$10 for a single ticket to 25 for \$100.

Dates and times are as follows: Thursday, December 4th 11a-9p; Friday, December 5th 11a-10p; Saturday, December 6th 10a-10p; Sunday, December 7th 11a-6p. Raffle winners will be drawn beginning at 5pm on Sunday and winners notified shortly thereafter.

A toy drive, with collection boxes in area businesses, starts in November and ends the final night of the Festival. Children's charities receive the toys and distribute them to those in need.

A Wine and Paint event is planned for Thursday. A lighting ceremony for the giant Wreath on the front of the building and live music by the Ben Allen Band will take place Friday evening. The December Art Walk also begins at 6pm on Friday. Saturday features live performances throughout the day, train rides, a fire truck, and an opportunity to let Santa know what is at the top of your wish list.

The City of Palms will be twinkling with lights. Businesses are open and offering something for everyone on your list. Decorations, food, art, music and activities for all ages and interests are waiting to lift your Christmas spirit in Fort Myers.



EDITOR THOUGHTS

December and Christmas brings back memories of my childhood growing up on our family farm in Northeast Iowa. Christmas eve was always exciting because we had to get all the chores finished up early to go to Christmas eve church services. My

brother and I were in the program every year. Being part of the baby boomer generation, in a small, predominately Lutheran town, meant that each Sunday school class had 20 or more children. Each class had a separate part in the program, which would take a couple of hours. We would go back to our rooms and receive a bag with candy, nuts, and an apple or orange. The anticipation of what might be under the tree when we arrived home was exciting. For you see, the only presents when we left were for our relatives on Christmas day. Somehow while we were gone, Santa had arrived with our presents and placed them under the tree. The miracles of Christmas, to this day I don't know how they appeared, while all four of our family went to church and back home in the family car, at the same time! Dad and Mom watched our whole program!

On Christmas day we would all go down to my Grandma Johnson's. She lived on a farm about nine miles away in the hills. The house sat at the end of a lane, on a hill with a creek running along the meadow to the East. Picture the scenes from a Christmas card. We would take our "flying saucers" and slide down the hill before dinner. My dads two sisters, and my mom in the kitchen preparing dinner. My dad, two uncles, and grandma are playing cards in the living room and drinking highballs. I grew up with seven cousins, all girls, four older, three younger. So naturally for Christmas one year, when I was about five or six, my brother and I each wanted a doll. Which we received, along with a spoked wheel, wicker doll buggy. A couple years later, toy John Deere tractors were much more important. It was an interesting early childhood.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

GRANDMA PEARL'S FATTIGMANN BAKKELS

6 EGGS

- 1 Cup. SUGAR
- 6 Tbsp. CREAM or 1/4 Cup. EVAPORATED MILK
- 4 Tbsp. or ¼ Cup. WHISKEY, COGNAC, or BRANDY
- 2 tsp. GROUND or POWDERED CARDAMOM SEED
- 4 Cups. FLOUR

Mix: Eggs, Sugar, Cream, Alcohol, and Cardamom in a mixing bowl. Start with 2 cups



of flour, adding flour as needed to form a soft dough, but not sticky. Transfer onto lightly floured parchment paper and roll out to ½ "thickness. Use a pizza cutter to cut into 2" width, diamond shapes and cut a slit in the center to fold in one end if desired. Fry in HOT FAT or LARD at 380* until lightly brown, turning once. Allow to cool and drain on brown paper. Dust with confectioners sugar if desired.

These are a Norwegian Christmas cookie that may be dusted with confectionery sugar or left plain. Fattigmann Bakkel in Norwegian means "Poor Man Cookie". Grandma Pearl made these the first week in December. She did not dust with powdered sugar but left them plain. She would store them in a brown paper grocery sack. (remember them?) As they aged, they became more flavorful as the fat drained out. The amount of alcohol required for the recipe was in direct proportion to how much Grandma consumed in the making of the bakkels.


PINE TREE KNOTS QUILT CLUB By Cindy Trepanier






FOREST PARKS HOME CHURCH "THE LIGHT"

• Unsightly Property – Be proud of your home. Keep your siding free of mold and mildew by power washing. Keep your lawn mowed and hedges trimmed. Be courteous to your neighbors. Be safe with unexpected storms.





Forest Park Green Car Stickers - We have night patrol in place to keep you and your property under a watchful eye. Cars on property without a green Forest Park Sticker on the back of the vehicle will be noted by the team and sent to the office. Stickers are available for FREE in the office. Using this identifier

helps us know if we have strangers in the park. This is to protect all of us. Visitors are required to have a sticker. If you don't want it stuck on your back window, tape it up on the inside. I see many vehicles without these stickers.

- Late Trash Set Outs All trash needs to be set out **before 7am on Tuesday**. Second rounds of trash pickup for late set outs are costly and really overworks our Maintenance Team if it gets too hot. Your trash can be put out the evening before if in a secured trash can.
- Late HOA Fees Please do your best to send your HOA fee in by the 1st of the month. It's also important to make your check payable for the exact amount of your HOA Fee rounding up or down adds additional work for our accounting team.
- Quiet Time/Lawn Mowing Our rules for Quiet Time are 10 PM to 7 AM. YEAR ROUND Please be respectful of your neighbors!
- HAZARDOUS WASTE



Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to approve the initiative to have all residents place paint, pesticides, chemicals, fluorescent bulbs and gas bottles at the curb. Park employees will

pick up these materials on regular trash pickup days and log them in. These articles will be stored and disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members.

• Aluminum Cans are still being collected on Monday evenings only. Please remember to put your aluminum cans in a bag and place UNDER YOUR MAILBOX by 5:00 P.M. MONDAY **EVENING** for pick up. Please make sure your cans are RINSED, CLEAN, and DRY.

Please place it away from trash bags. DO NOT place plastic, glass or metal cans in the bag,

Aluminum cans only! All the others go in the blue

- recycle bins. If you are putting your aluminum cans out on Friday for the recycle truck, PLEASE consider putting your cans in a bag on Monday evening for pickup. Money collected from can recycling helps pay some of the costs of Social Club activities. It benefits all residents of Forest Park.
- Improper Use of Dumpsters Dumpsters are CLEARLY marked. It's dangerous for the Maintenance Team to climb into the dumpster to retrieve improperly dumped items. Contractors working on your home are also required to take the debris with them off site.

ATTENTION

The following rules still apply, only household trash is allowed in the compactor, all cardboard should be set out on Friday for

recycle, no horticulture, construction materials, or bulk items. Bulk items include any furniture, cushions, bulky pillows or life jackets. Any Aluminum may be placed near the workbench in front of the horticulture dumpster for recycling, (this includes aluminum framed lawn chairs, pop-up tent frames, carport roofs, or gutters that are aluminum. Appliances go in the metal trailer parked southwest of the compactor. If it is not regular household trash, horticulture, appliances, aluminum, or construction materials, it is a BULK ITEM. The dumpsters are clearly marked. If the gate is locked, PLEASE lock the gate when you leave, to keep unauthorized people out of the R/V Park!! If you notice a vehicle in the R/V area, without a green tree sticker, PLEASE notify the office or if after hours call a board member or the sheriffs office. These people are trespassing, leaving unauthorized refuse, and costing everyone in the park more money!!!

Notice the RED BUTTON on the controller. This is for emergencies only. DO NOT TOUCH THE RED **BUTTON!**
