THE NEWLY REFURBISHED VETERANS MEMORIAL

Last spring the **Forest Park Social and Tool Clubs** decided to honor our country's 250th birthday by upgrading and refurbishing the Veterans Memorial in front of the Clubhouse.

The memorial was originally installed about fourteen years ago. **Paul and Carolyn Hodson** purchased the five, eighteen inch concrete medallions, which represented each branch of the U.S. military, while home in Illinois. Paul, **Ron Moon**, and a group of volunteers poured the concrete footing and base to mount the military seals, along with the two flag poles in the front.

The Social Club voted to purchase and donate six new flag poles and flags, representing the six branches of the military to be erected behind the current memorial. The Tool Club voted to donate the materials and labor to install the sleeves and poles.

Upon inspecting the five military medallion seals, it was obvious that they had not weathered the last 14 years of Florida hurricanes, heat and tropical rains very well. (Notice the bottom left picture on the front page). It was time that they be repainted. Our resident artist, **Marco Passos**, was contacted and promptly volunteered to repaint each of the seals. Determining the proper colors became problematic, as each flag uses a different color. In all, there are 22 different colors of paint. Each medallion was hand painted twice and then given two coats of clear sealer to protect them from the elements. Marcos' attention to detail created seals that are actually better than when they were new. (Notice the bottom right picture on the front page).

Forest Park would not be where we are if it weren't for our volunteers. The six men who designed, laid out the pattern, and installed the flag poles are **Dave Loper, Bob Wing, Monte Johnson, Rick Lawton, and Dave Starky. Keith Lewis** was not available for the picture.

A huge **Thank You** goes to **AMS of North Fort Myers** and our own **THE LIGHT CHURCH** right here in Forest Park for their generous monetary donations.

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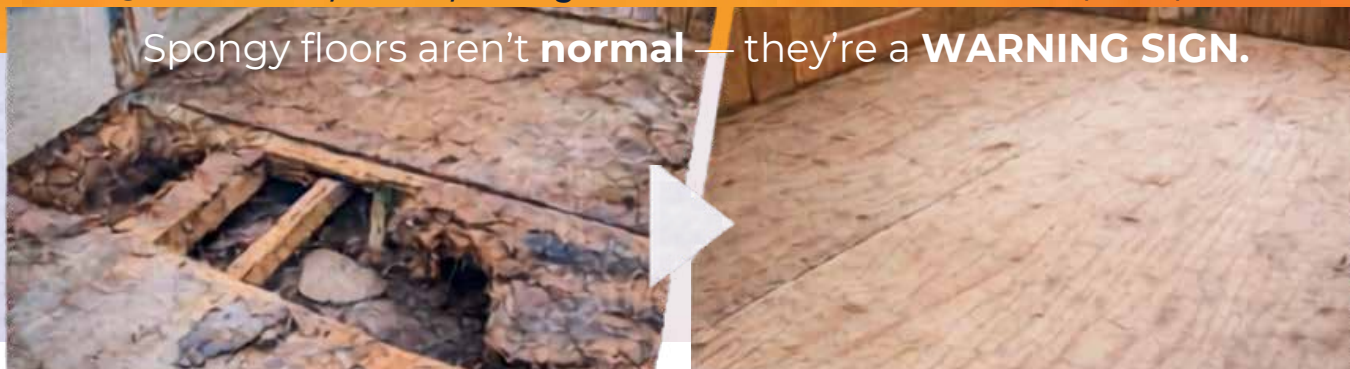

They are the properties that have issues with grass cutting, weeding of flower beds, of areas that are stoned, and cleaning of the homes in general, meaning power washing off the mildew from the home. The landlords are the ones responsible for making sure these things get done, but the people who rent these properties have to make sure the landlords follow through on their responsibilities, not only to themselves, but to the beauty of the park as well. It's important that everyone who lives in Forest Park has a responsibility to be a good steward of the community, whether you are an owner or a renter. Lightning Safety

- If you hear thunder, go indoors
- Avoid windows, metal, and standing water

Evacuation Readiness

- Know your zone and route
- Keep your vehicle fueled
- Have a plan for pets

Community Awareness

- Report issues to volunteers
- Check nearby vacant homes after storms
- Share weather alerts with neighbors

• You'll receive a reminder phone call the day prior to pickup.

• Have your hazardous waste at the end of your driveway no later than 9 AM on the date of pickup.

• Your hazardous waste will be picked up at your residence between 9AM - 11AM.

• **DO NOT** take any hazardous waste to the RV storage/trash dumpsters.

• Only those residents who call and schedule will be picked up - NO EXCEPTIONS

Enchilada Casserole

12 corn tortillas

8 oz mild enchilada sauce Onions - chopped

Cheddar cheese - grated

Black olives - sliced

Cooking oil

1 lb ground beef

Fry ground beef, break into small pieces while cooking, drain. Lightly fry tortillas, drain on paper towels. Heat enchilada sauce in a saucepan. Dip tortillas in sauce, cover bottom of casserole dish in one layer. Layer ground beef, onions, cheese and olives over tortillas. Spoon portion of sauce over. Repeat layers until ingredients are used. Bake in a 350° oven until warmed through.

Many of our snowbirds are up north. We have switched to our full time resident night patrol roster for the summer. Please consider **VOLUNTEERING for Neighborhood Watch/Night Patrol**. It's only **one night per month**. If you are **full time or new to the park**, feel free to pick up information and a **volunteer** form at the office. Keeping a watchful eye on our park residents and residences is vitally important to the safety and security of everyone in our Park. In the past we have had bicycles, golf carts, and tools stolen, as well as squatters moving into vacant homes. We have also had drug activity. No one wants that in our Park. **Info you see something suspicious or you will need to call: Sheriff # 239-477-1000 if an emergency call 911.**

Patrol Hours: Suggested patrol hours 11:00 pm-1:00 am. But....to deter anyone, you may vary your hours. If you are a night owl 🦉, feel free to take a ride at any time during your assigned evening. You drive up and down each street, check the clubhouse and activity/office doors, and surrounding outdoor areas.

Sit at the entrance for about 15 or so minutes. Your presence makes a lot of difference to those driving, walking, and riding bikes on Hart Road. Our presence with that flashing light makes all of us feel safer.

CHECK Doors at clubhouse, activity building, and pool restrooms. They automatically lock around 8:00 pm.

BE SURE YOU PICK UP THE BACKPACK IN THE ACTIVITY BUILDING AND RETURN IT BY

NOON THE NEXT DAY. INSIDE YOU WILL FIND A FLASHING LIGHT, 📖 NOTEBOOK, FLASHLIGHT, AND MAGNETIC SIGNS FOR YOUR VEHICLE, PLUS SOME INFO AND PARK DIRECTORY

If you find doors unlocked, lights on, try to turn them off and lock doors. Sometimes the restroom doors are not locked. Go inside and lock the interior door. **NOTIFY THE OFFICE THE NEXT MORNING OF ANY ISSUES!!**

If any of the street lights are out, get the number on the pole, street, and closest house number and report this to the office.

NEVER CONFRONT ANY INTRUDER OR TRESPASSER... CALL THE SHERIFF IMMEDIATELY. 🚔 The Night Patrol Coordinator for the Park is **Gloria Restko**. Gloria has been a full time resident of the Park for many years. You may see Gloria and Mr. Bill in her white golf cart out and about.

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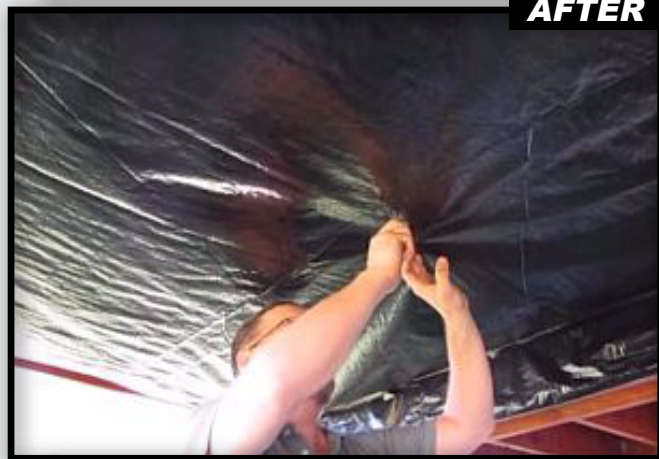

Remember to keep your info up to date and your item tagged, insured, and in working order. **If you have not moved your RV, trailer, boat, etc. in the last 9 months, you are depriving someone else of a spot in our park.** Our rules state that if you have not used your spot for 9 months, your spot may be reassigned to someone else. If you have not moved it in 9 months, it may be considered not using your spot. **Beginning October 1st, the park will begin charging \$1 per foot of occupied length per month for your spot.** You are abusing the privilege of a **FREE** spot (for now). Other residents may be waiting for a spot. If you no longer need your spot, please let the office know. If you need a spot to store your RV, trailer, boat, etc let the office know so you can be put on the list. **IF YOU HAVE A BOAT, CAMPER, OR TRAILER IN YOUR DRIVEWAY FOR OVER 48 HOURS; THIS IS A VIOLATION OF THE RULES & REGULATIONS THAT YOU AGREED TO WHEN PURCHASING IN FOREST PARK! PLEASE INQUIRE OF A SPACE IN OUR R/V PARK OR FIND A COMMERCIAL STORAGE AREA TO RENT.**

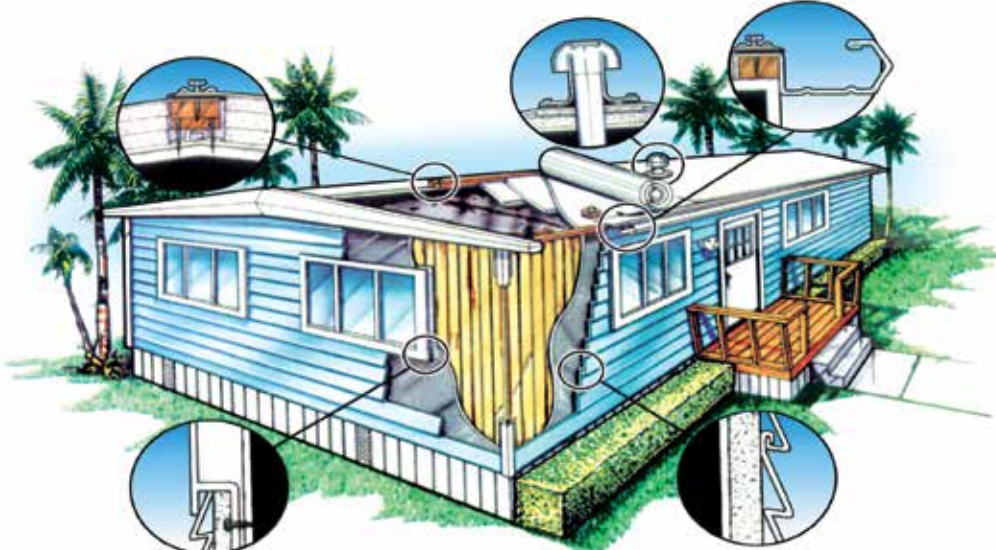


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RESIDENTS NEED TO REMEMBER:

- **Speeding** – The park has many walkers and bike riders, please obey the speed limits. The speeding near the Pool, Pickle Ball and Clubhouse area has truly become a danger! Members pull in and out of the area regularly on golf carts and bicycles, they will have no protection against a speeding vehicle. **Throughout the Park our Posted Speed Limit is 15 MPH.**



- **Rolling through Stop Signs** – Each intersection is clearly marked; our park is **no different than a regular road**. The only difference is you could be hurting your neighbor or their family. Take it easy and obey the Stop Signs.



- **Unattended Guests in the Pool** – Guests should have a **GREEN WRISTBAND** when using the pool. When asked, they should know the address of the member they're visiting. Please be vigilant.

- **Unsightly Property** – Be proud of your home. Keep your siding free of mold and mildew by power washing. Keep your lawn mowed and hedges trimmed. Be courteous to your neighbors. Be safe with unexpected storms.



- **Forest Park Green Car Stickers** - We have night patrol in place to keep you and your property under a watchful eye. Cars on property without a green Forest Park Sticker on the back of the vehicle will be noted by the team and sent to the office. Stickers are available for **FREE** in the office. **Using this identifier helps us know if we have strangers in the park. This is to protect all of us.** Visitors are required to have a sticker. If you don't want it stuck on your back window, tape it up on the inside. I see many vehicles without these stickers.



- **Late Trash Set Outs** – All trash needs to be set out **before 7am on Tuesday**. Second rounds of trash pickup for late set outs are costly and really overworks our Maintenance Team if it gets too hot. Your trash can be put out the evening before if in a **secured** trash can.



- **Late HOA Fees** – Please do your best to send your HOA fee in by the 1st of the month. It's also important to make your check payable for the **exact amount** of your HOA Fee rounding up or down adds additional work for our accounting team.



- **Quiet Time/Lawn Mowing** – Our rules for Quiet Time are 10 PM to 7 AM. **YEAR ROUND Please be respectful of your neighbors!**

**• HAZARDOUS WASTE**

Lee County has very strict regulations regarding hazardous material disposal. The Board voted to no longer allow these materials (paint, pesticides, chemicals, fluorescent bulbs and gas bottles) to be picked up at the curb. These articles should be disposed of in the appropriate manner by staff members.



- **Aluminum Cans** are still being collected on **Monday evenings only**. Please remember to put your aluminum cans in a bag and place **UNDER YOUR MAILBOX by 5:00 P.M. MONDAY EVENING** for pick up. Please make sure your cans are **RINSED, CLEAN, and DRY**.



Please place it away from trash bags. **DO NOT** place plastic, glass or metal cans in the bag.

Aluminum cans only! All the others go in the blue recycle bins. If you are putting your aluminum cans out on Friday for the recycle truck, **PLEASE** consider putting your cans in a bag on Monday evening for pickup. **Money collected from can recycling helps pay some of the costs of Social Club activities. It benefits all residents of Forest Park.**

- **Improper Use of Dumpsters** – Dumpsters are **CLEARLY** marked. It's dangerous for the Maintenance Team to climb into the dumpster to retrieve improperly dumped items. **Contractors working on your home are also required to take the debris with them off site.**

ATTENTION

The following rules still apply, **only household trash is allowed in the compactor, all cardboard should be set out on Friday for recycle, no horticulture, construction materials, or bulk items. Bulk items include any furniture, cushions, bulky pillows or life jackets.**

Any Aluminum may be placed near the workbench in front of the horticulture dumpster for recycling, (this includes aluminum framed lawn chairs, pop-up tent frames, carport roofs, or gutters that are aluminum. Appliances go in the metal trailer parked southwest of the compactor. If it is not regular household trash, horticulture, appliances, aluminum, or construction materials, it is a BULK ITEM. The dumpsters are clearly marked. If the gate is locked, PLEASE lock the gate when you leave, to keep unauthorized people out of the R/V Park!! If you notice a vehicle in the R/V area, without a green tree sticker, PLEASE notify the office or if after hours call a board member or the sheriff's office. These people are trespassing, leaving unauthorized refuse, and costing everyone in the park more money!!! Absolutely no tires are to be left in the R/V Park!
